Pedestrian Safety

I'm excited about having a dedicated, safe place to walk from Sevier Park to Brown Creek Park. Also, additional connections and plantings.

What are your preferences on lighting?

Support significant lighting all along the greenway

Yes to lighting, but please make it bird-safe and dark sky friendly! Wildlife become disoriented by lighting at night and suffer grave consequences. Also light pollution!

Lighting is very important for the greenway. At mid-block crossings, pedestrians can activate the flashing lights rather than have it flashing 24/7. Lighting under 440 is very important for safety.

No flashing lights near Craig Ave

Flashing lights at Lealand Ln and Craig Ave

Prefer signalized and flashing lights for pedestrian crossing (not just paint) at Lealand Ln

Other ideas:

Can you try to connect through Gale Park to Granny White/12th to existing walking lane on Battlefield Dr

As a greenway, it is "green" in that it is connecting green spaces and providing for ped/bike activity but there should also be landscaping and planting as much as possible - maybe some greenery also as part of retaining walls.

Add crosswalk across Battlefield at Craig Ave

Add crosswalk at the corner of Battlefield to Lealand Ln

Full traffic signal at Lealand Ln

Crosswalk across Woodmont at General Hood or General Bate for pedestrians to reach Browns Creek

TDOT R.O.W. on corners of Battlefield and Granny White and Battlefield and Belmont should be part of Greenway plan

Place crosswalk at corner of Craig Ave and Battlefield Drive
