000 How the Metro Public Health Department Serves Our Community

Clinic Services

The Metro Public Health Department clinics offer services for maternal and infant health, immunizations, sexually transmitted infections, HIV/AIDS, family planning, oral health care and more.

As of October, 1, 2018, we transitioned to an appointment-based system to help us serve our clients more efficiently. Walk-ins are always welcome but may experience longer wait times.

Family Planning .. 615-340-5607

Family planning clinics provide counseling and education, pregnancy testing, birth control, pre-conception exams, and emergency contraception. The cost for family planning services is based on income.

Oral Health Clinic..615-340-5601

Oral health care is offered to children up to the age of 21. Limited adult emergency care is also available. TennCare is accepted. Other services are offered on a sliding scale, based on income.

Sexual Health Clinic....615-340-5647

The Sexual Health Clinic provides examination and treatment to those who suspect they have a sexually transmitted infection such as gonorrhea, syphilis, chlamydia, or herpes. The cost is based on family income. There is a \$10 minimum fee for service **(HIV testing is free).**

WIC..... 615-340-7788

The Women’s Infants and Children program provides healthy food vouchers, nutrition education, and breastfeeding promotion to participants of the program. WIC is available to pregnant and post-partum women, infants, and children up to the age of five who meet the income requirements.

Immunizations 615-340-5607

Vaccinating our families using the recommended immunization schedules not only protects our loved ones, but also our entire community. The Immunization Clinic offers routine immunizations to children and adults. Appointments are recommended.

TB Elimination615-340-5650

The TB Clinic provides TB screening for Davidson County residents. Those who are determined to be at risk may receive additional screening including skin testing and chest x-rays. Preventive treatment for latent TB is available and provided free of charge.

Pest Management 615-340-5660

Pest Management Services provides on-site monitoring and control of insects such as mosquitoes, ticks, rats, mice, and other animals that are capable of transmitting disease. Information regarding management of bed bugs can be provided on request.

Birth Certificates 615-340-5611

Birth certificates are available in short and long form. Both forms cost \$15. The short form is available for Tennessee births dating back to 1949. The long form is available for births that occurred in Davidson County after 1966.

Immunization Records

Immunization records are required for children to attend school in Nashville. Records are available at all three Public Health Centers and at your private healthcare provider.

Animal Care and Control

Metro Animal Care and Control welcomes visitors, whether you are searching for your lost pet or looking to adopt your next pet. MACC is open 10am-4pm, seven days a week.

Behavioral Health 615-340-2172

Counselors are available Monday through Friday to conduct assessments and make referrals to local counseling agencies for those who are age 13 and older and who need Substance Abuse or Mental Health services. There is no charge for these assessments or referrals.

Food Protective Services

The food division provides protection from the threat of foodborne illnesses by conducting inspections among Davidson County's food establishments and mobile food trucks.
