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Summary

- 1) **Reported Crimes:** Major reported crimes increased 6.8% in Davidson County from 2021 to 2022. Violent crimes increased 5.6% and property crimes increased 7.3% (page 3).
- 2) **Arrests:** In 2022 adult physical arrests increased 9.8% above 2021. State Citation arrests decreased 7.3% below 2021 (page 4).
- 3) **Arrests by Gender:** males were 77.1% of physical arrests and females were 22.9% in 2022. Males were 69.0% of State Citations while females were 31% (page 4).
- 4) **Arrests by Race:** In 2022, Whites comprised 50.2% of physical arrests while Blacks comprised 48.9%. Whites were 59.6% of citation arrests and Blacks were 37.0% (page 6).
- 5) **Arrests by Ethnicity:** Hispanics were 11.3% and Non-Hispanics were 88.6% of physical arrests in 2022. Hispanics were 31.9% of citation arrests while Non-Hispanics made up 67.4% (page 7).
- 6) **Arrest Rates:** Davidson County had 2,450 physical arrests per 100,000 residents in 2022; State citations were issued at the rate of 742 per 100,000 residents (page 9).
- 7) **Bond Releases:** Overall, bond releases increased 0.7% in 2022. Releases to bonding companies were 51.4% of all bond types and decreased 4.2%. Pretrial releases were 32.2% of bonds and increased 8.0% (page 10).
- 8) **Bond Set Amount:** The average bond amount set for all defendants in 2022 was \$10,654. The average bond amount for a felony defendant was \$26,934 and \$1,845 for a misdemeanor (pages 11-12).
- 9) **Days In Jail Before Release:** In 2022, defendants spent an average of 5.92 days in jail before posting bond or case disposition. Felony defendants averaged 13.46 days and misdemeanants averaged 1.95 days in jail (page 13-14).
- 10) **Percent Who Posted Bond:** In 2022, 67.1% of all defendants posted bond before release. 32.9% were released without posting bond (charges disposed or dismissed) (page 15).
- 11) **General Sessions Court Volume:** General Sessions Court processed 10.0% more defendants with a new filing in 2022 compared to 2021. General Sessions Court concluded 4.5% more defendants and bound over 3.3% more defendants to Criminal Court (pages 18-19).
- 12) **Criminal Court Volume:** Criminal Court processed 3.4% more defendants with new filings in 2022. There were 8.4% more defendants disposed. Criminal Court had 7.7% fewer defendants with probation violation filings and 7.1% fewer defendants with probation violations disposed in 2022 compared to 2021 (pages 20-21).
- 13) **General Sessions Case Processing Times:** On average, the time needed to process defendants in General Sessions Court in 2022 was 156.9 days, a decrease of 20.7% from 2021. Average time from arrest to bound over was 92.6 days, while arrest to disposition was 174.9 days. Jailed defendants averaged 16.8 days to conclusion. Bond defendants averaged 235.2 days to conclusion (pages 22-23).

- 14) **Criminal Court Case Processing Times:** In 2022 the average time to process defendants from bound over to filing in Criminal Court was 74.5 days, a decrease of 9.8% from 2021. From filing to disposition in Criminal Court took 392.3 days on average, a 2.9% increase. Cases disposed by trial averaged 839.9 days from filing to disposition in 2022. Jailed defendants took 290.7 days, while bond defendants took 446.8 days from filing in Criminal Court to disposition (pages 24-27).
- 15) **ADP:** The average daily inmate population in Davidson County correctional facilities increased from 1,565 in 2021 to 1,699 in 2022, an 8.5% increase (page 28).
- 16) **ADP by Gender:** Males comprised 89.4% of the ADP in 2022 while females made up 10.6% (page 29).
- 17) **ADP by Race:** By race, 38.9% of the 2022 ADP was White, and 60.3% was Black (page 30).
- 18) **ADP by Ethnicity:** 92.6% of the 2022 ADP was non-Hispanic; 7.2% were Hispanic (page 31).
- 19) **ADP by Age:** The median inmate age in 2022 was 33.9. The largest inmate age group was 21-44, representing 72.9% of the total inmate population (page 32).
- 20) **ADP by Charge Classification:** The largest inmate charge class in the 2022 ADP was Pretrial Felons, which comprised 52.0% of the total and increased 8.5% above 2021 levels. Locally Sentenced Felons were the second largest group, with 20.9% of the total ADP, and increased 9.6%. Other notable charge classes: Felony Probation Violators (7.1%), Convicted Misdemeanants (5.6%), Pretrial Misdemeanants (4.8%). Federal Inmates (DHS/ICE and Other Federal) accounted for 3.0% of the total ADP, dropping 7.7% (pages 33-37).
- 21) **ADP by Most Serious Arrested Charge:** 50.5% of the 2022 ADP had an Offense Against Person as their most serious charge. This was the largest category and included Homicides, Assaults, Robberies, and Rapes. Criminal Homicide was the single largest arrested charge, accounting for 7.7% of the 2022 ADP. Inmates arrested for Property Offenses were 12.1% of the ADP. 19.1% of the ADP had Offenses Against Courts and Government (mostly parole and probation violations). Public Health and Safety Offenses (mainly drug charges) accounted for 13.3% of the inmates (page 38).
- 22) **Incarceration Rates:** Davidson County incarcerated 239.9 inmates (including locally sentenced felons) per 100,000 residents in 2022, more than Knox County at 219.8 and Rutherford County at 214.4, but fewer than Hamilton County at 297.3 and Shelby County at 412.3. When the locally sentenced felons are removed, Davidson County's incarceration rate drops to 189.8 for 2022 (page 39).
- 23) **Juveniles:** There were no juveniles incarcerated in the adult correctional system in 2022. As of July 2015, juveniles adjudicated as adults are housed with Juvenile Detention. There were 21 juveniles transferred to the adult system from Juvenile Court in 2022, a 200% increase from 2021 (page 40).

TOTAL AND GENDER

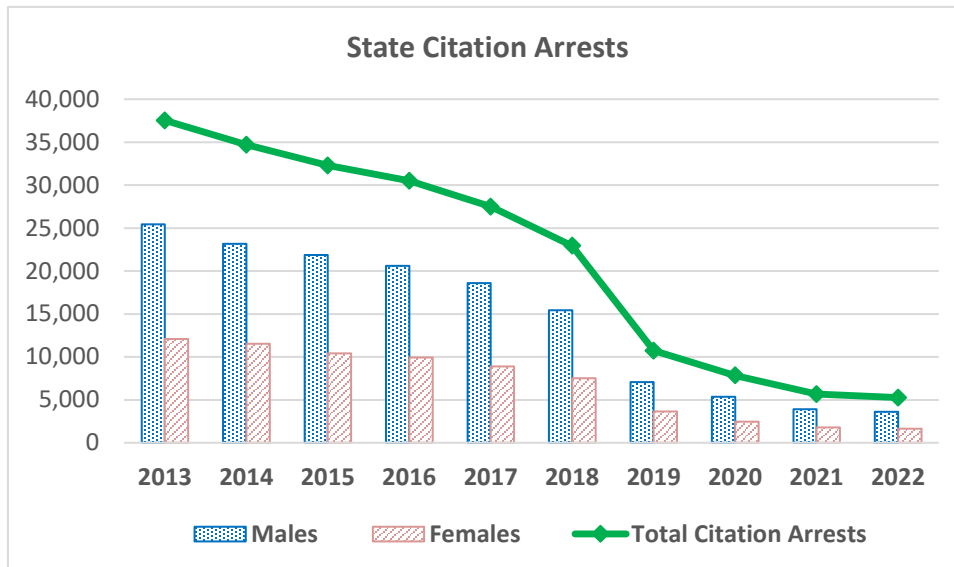
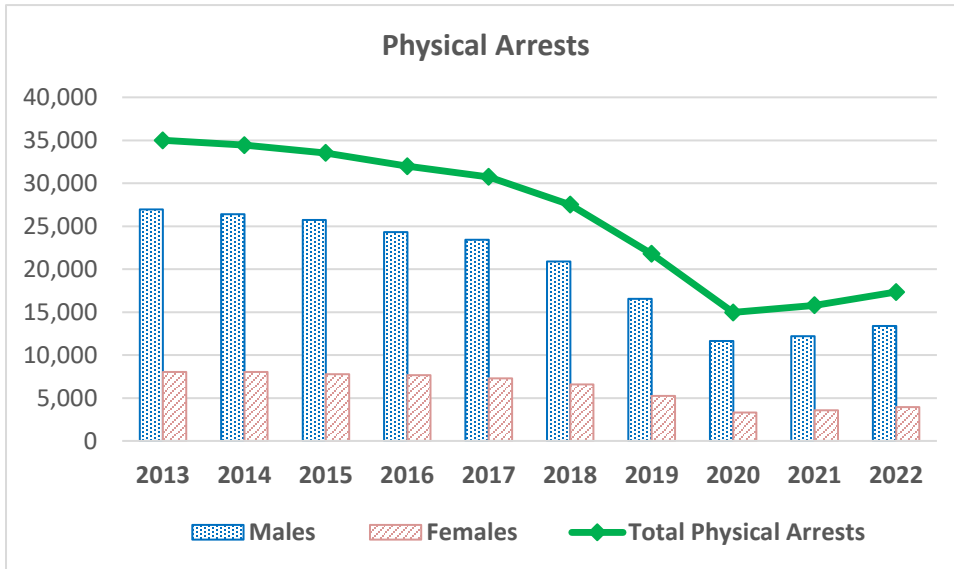

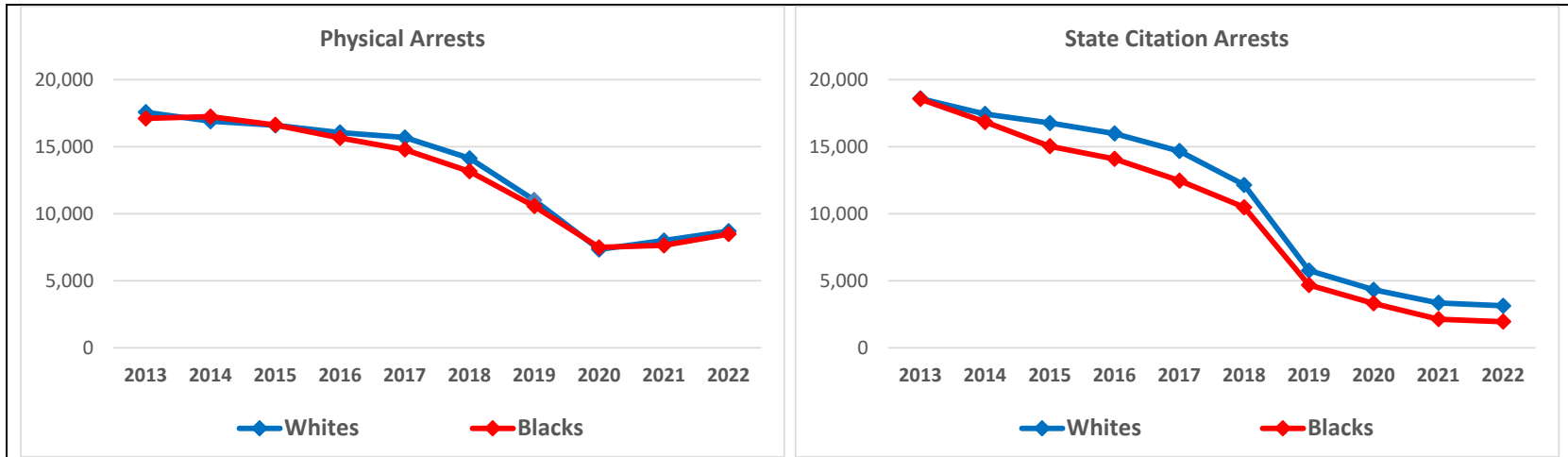

ETHNICITY

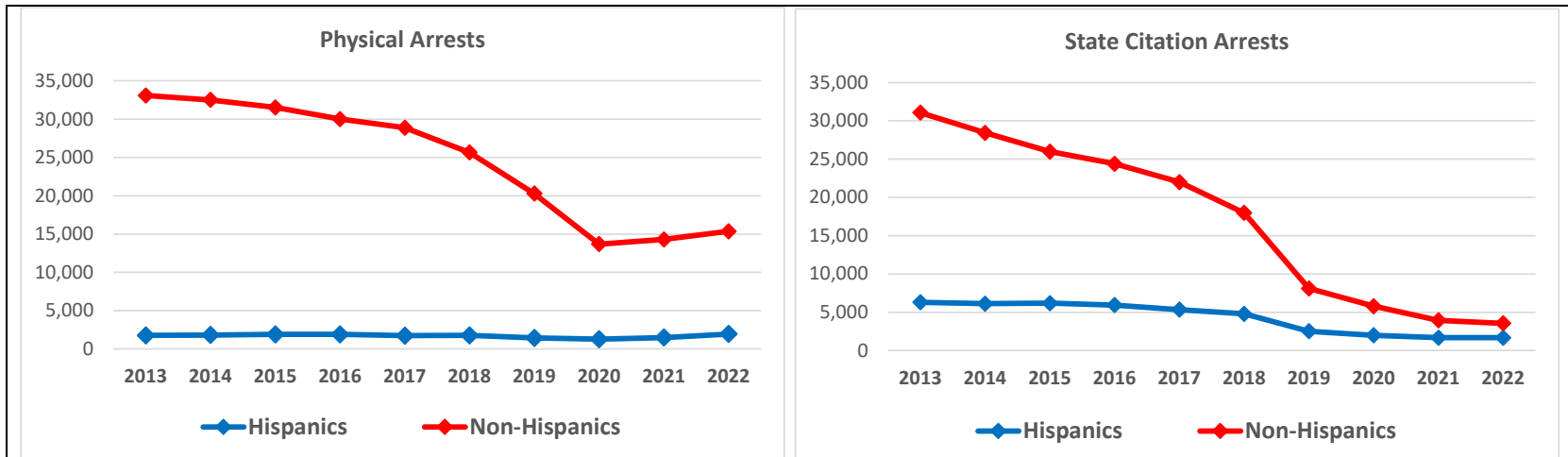

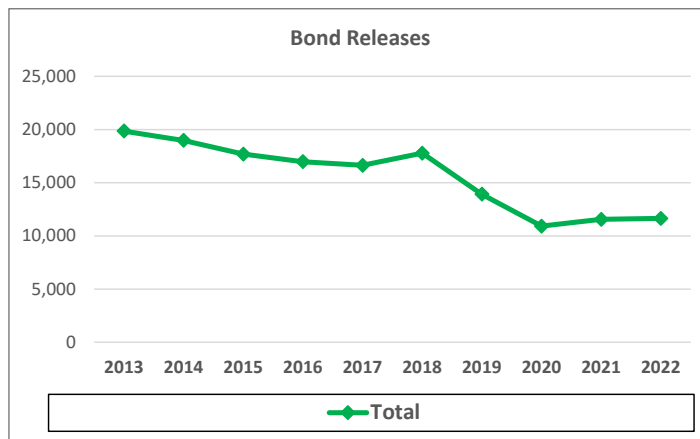


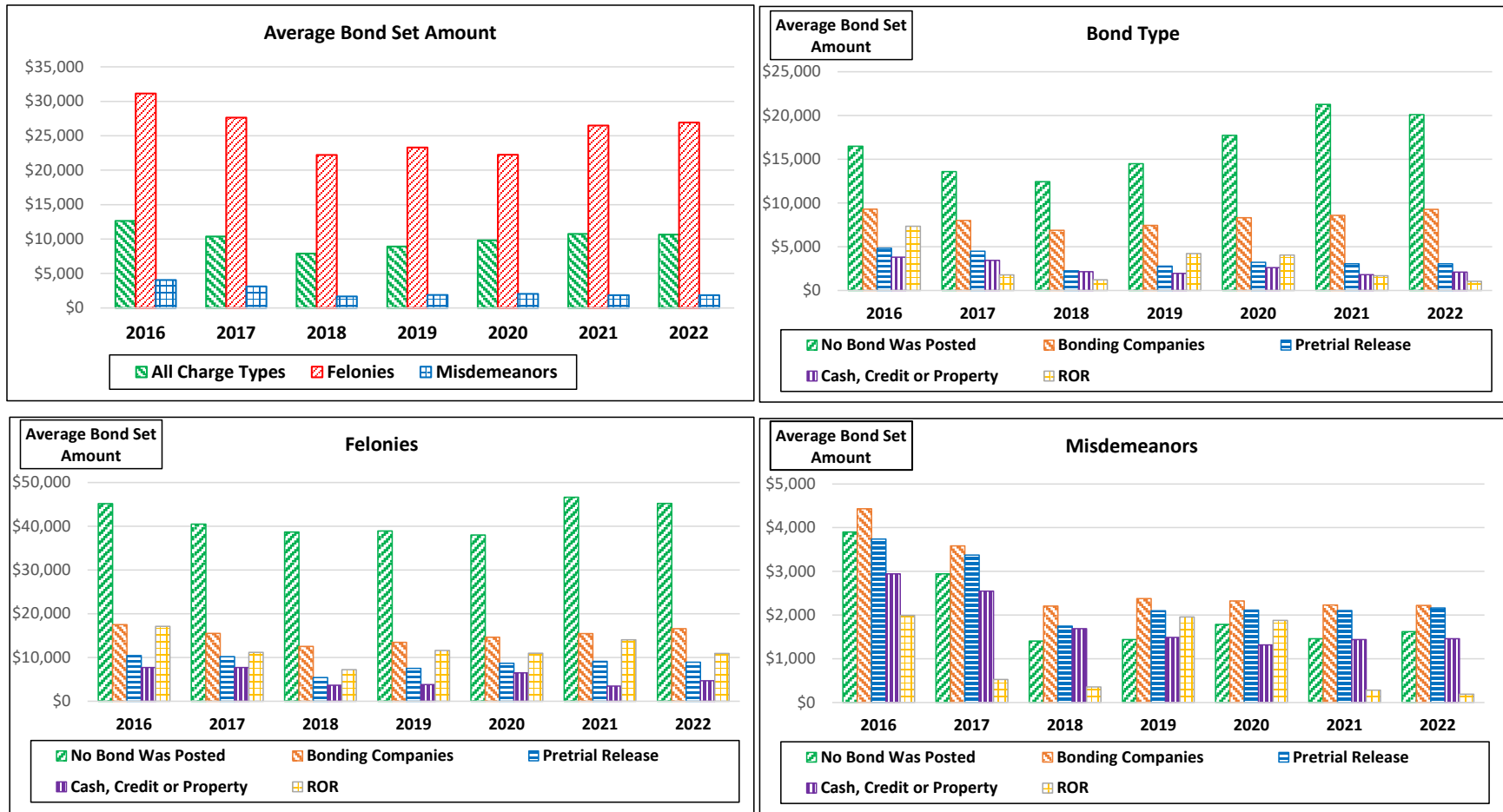

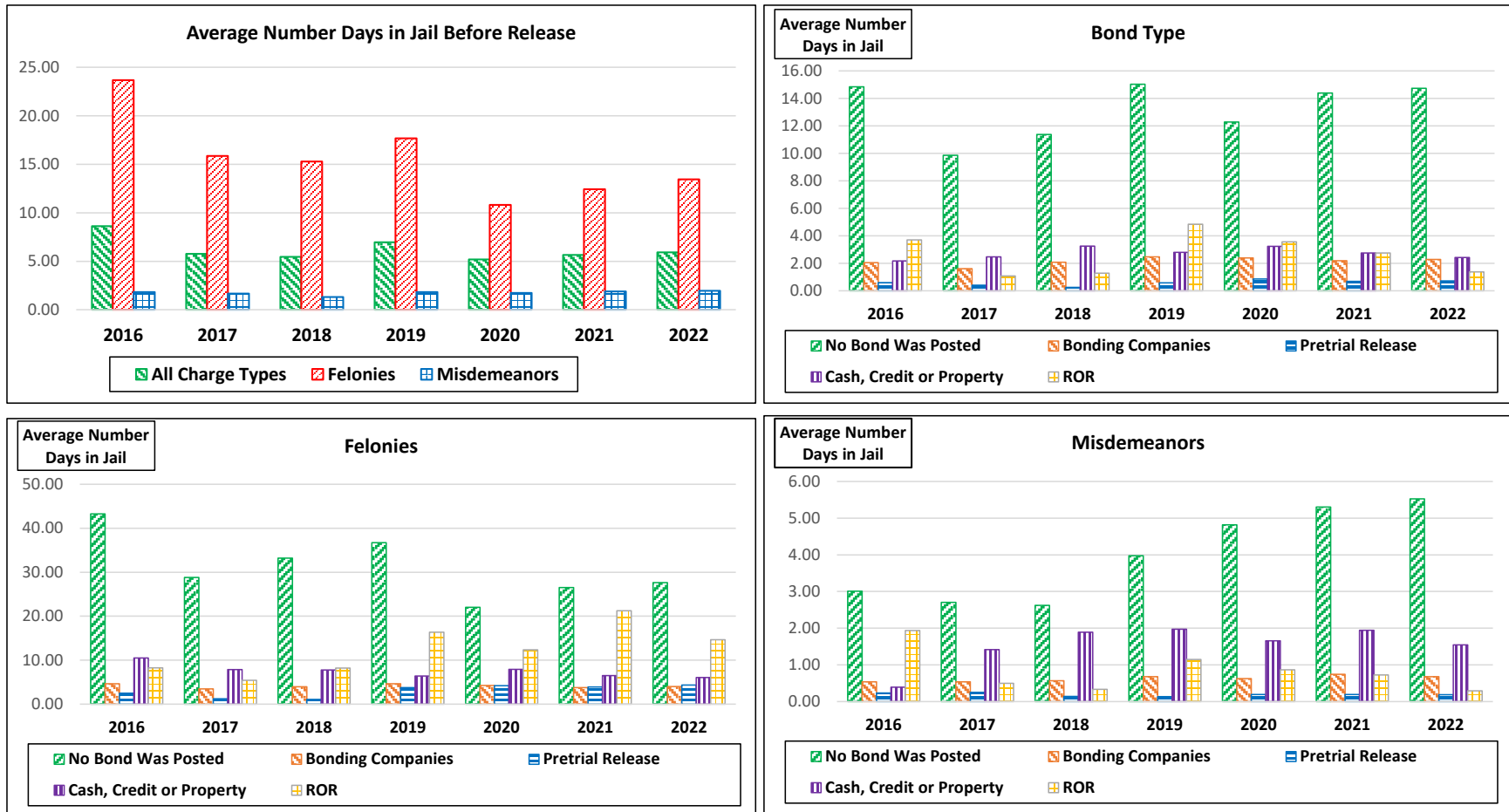

NOTES FOR TABLES 7-9:

- 1) Data includes all defendants with warrants on new cases filed in General Sessions Court. Felony and misdemeanor arrested charges are included. Each defendant represents a single person and all charges filed against that person at the time the person is taken into custody. Bond and case disposition data are accurate as of the date the data was pulled. Defendants with an incomplete bond status as of the data pull date are excluded from the analysis. Therefore, defendants in this report have either posted bond or had their charges disposed. Defendants bound over to Criminal Court are included only if they have posted bond or been disposed in Criminal Court.
- 2) The charge type (felony, misdemeanor) and charge classification are determined using the most serious arrested charge for the defendant at case filing date. Civil charges are included in the total but excluded in the detail lists.
- 3) Bond information is determined using Bond Set, Bond Reset, and Bond Post events and bond payment tables in CJIS.
- 4) Bond Set: Monetary bond amounts are at the defendant level. Bond set amounts are the sum of all bonds set for all charges pending when the defendant is brought into custody. The bond amount set is the amount that is forfeited if the defendant fails to appear in court or to comply with the conditions of the bond. In situations where the bond amount is reset than the reset amount is used in this report.
- 5) Bond Post: In Davidson County, after a defendant is arrested and brought to custody a commissioner sets a bail bond amount. Once the bond is set, the accused can pay the cash amount, obtain a property bond, get released to the Pretrial program, get released on their own recognizance (ROR), or hire a professional bond company (surety bond).
- 6) No Bond Posted: The defendant's charges were disposed, and no bond was posted prior to disposition. A small number were released prior to disposition without posting bond at the discretion of the court.
- 7) Days in Jail: Calculated using the number of days in jail from case filing to jail release upon posting bond. If no bond was posted, we used the number of days in jail from case filing to case disposition. If the defendant was bound over to Criminal Court, jail days included all days from case filing in General Sessions Court up to bond posting or disposition while in Criminal Court.
- 8) Statistics on bond amounts and jail days were calculated using values within 2 standard deviations + or - the mean to remove extreme values. Two standard deviations around the mean account for approximately 95% of the data population.

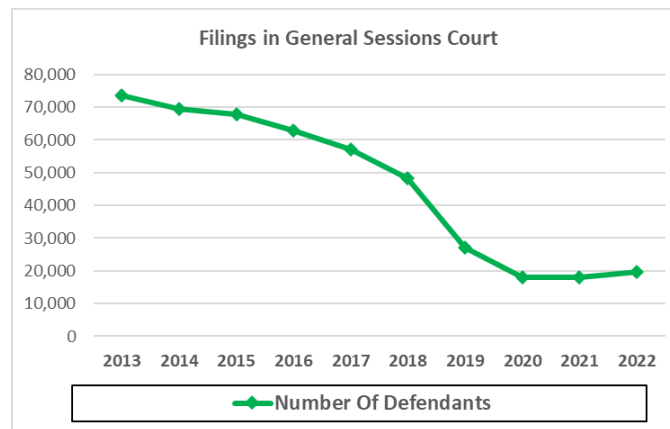

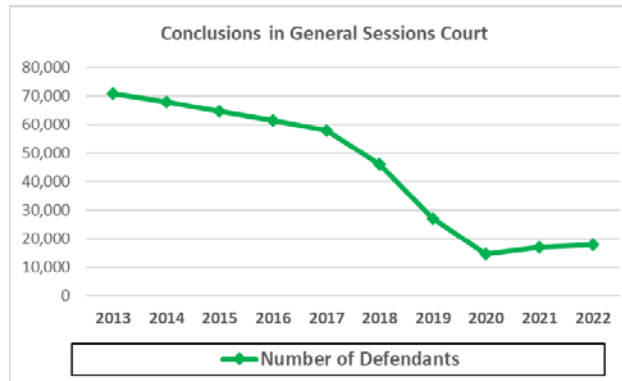

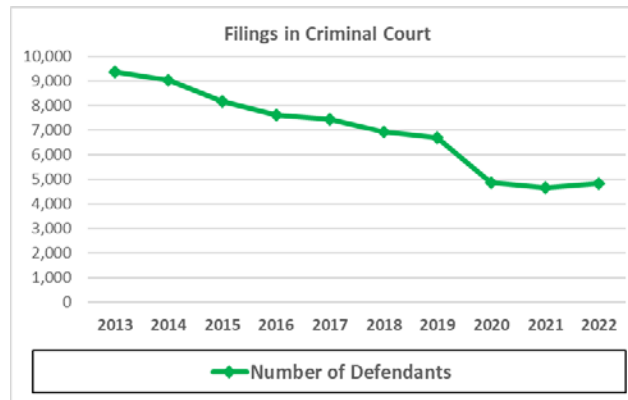

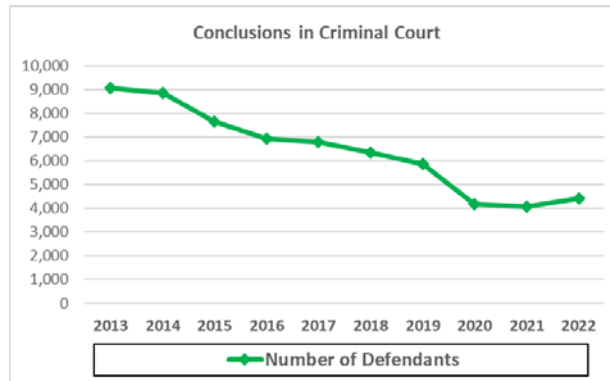

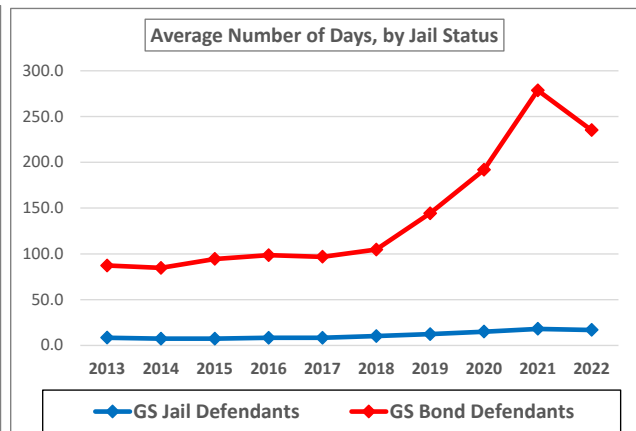

CASE PROCESSING TIMES IN CRIMINAL COURT 2013 – 2022

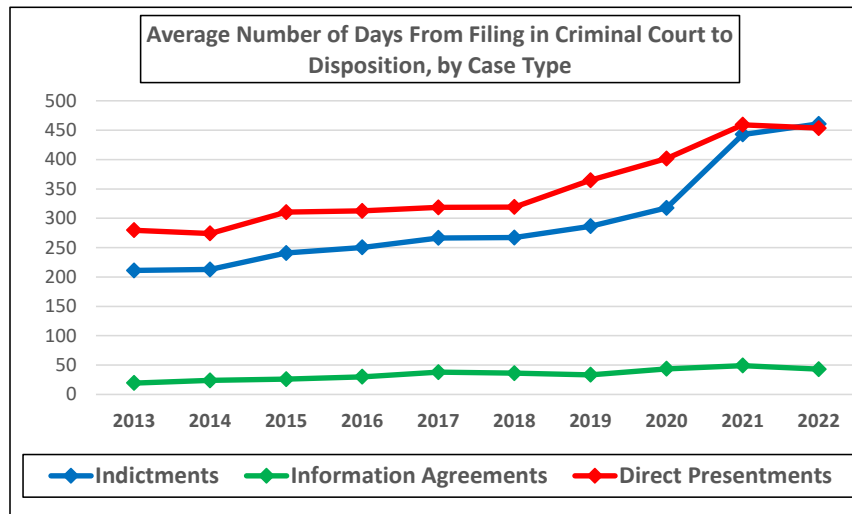
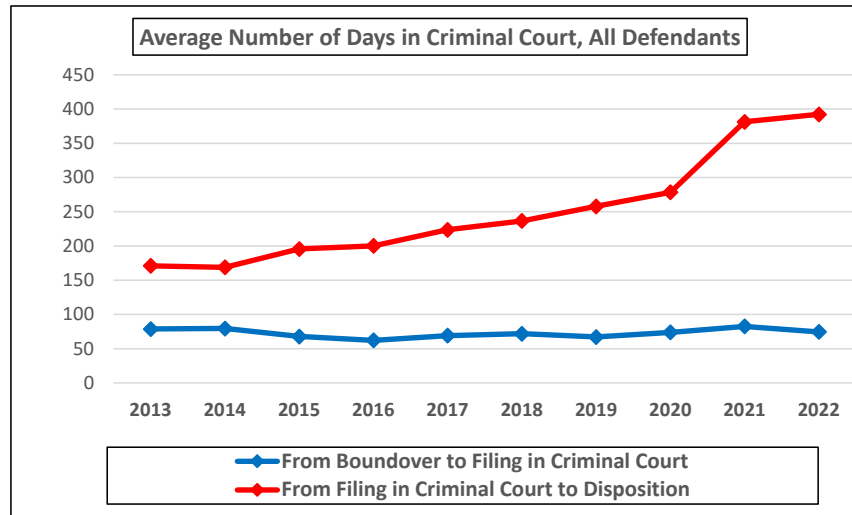

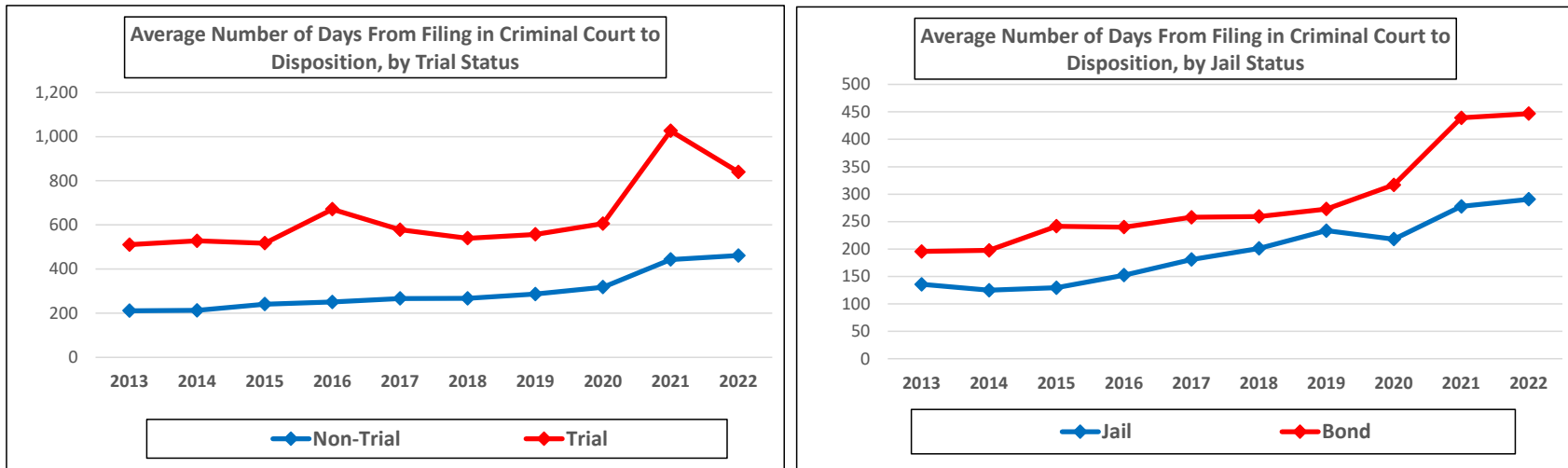

CASE PROCESSING TIMES IN CRIMINAL COURT 2013 – 2022



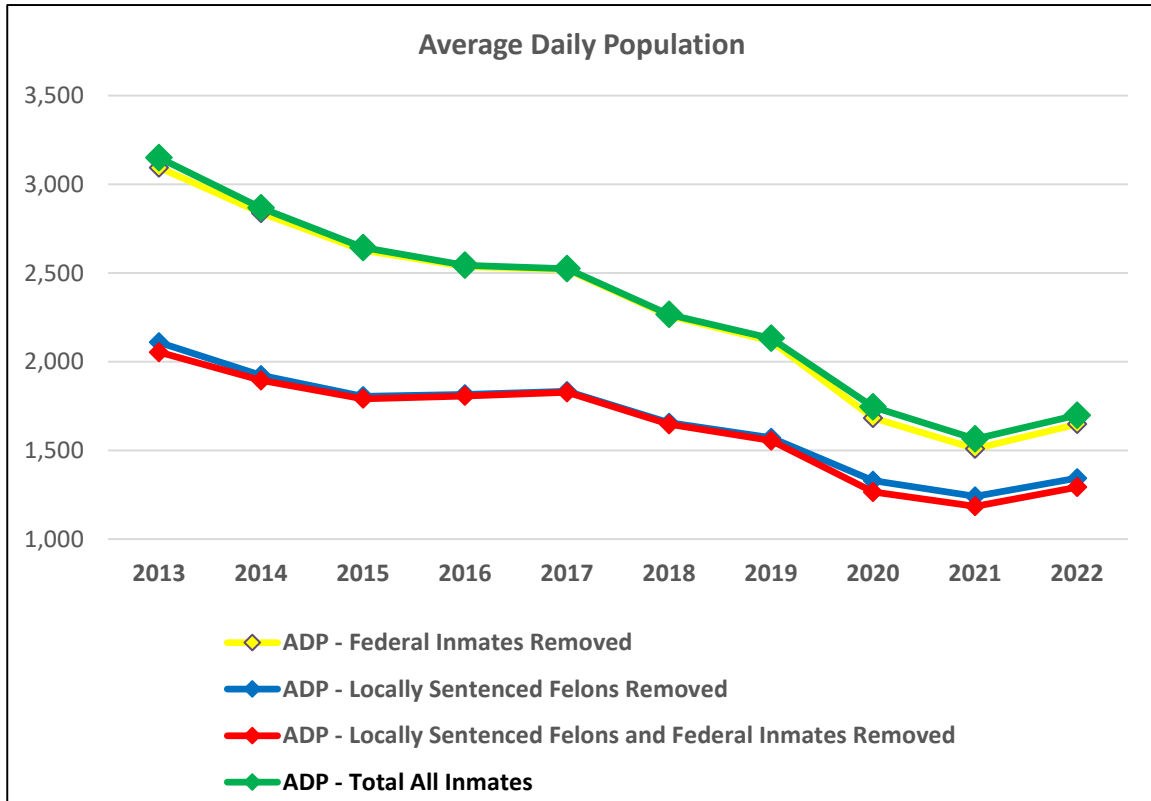
