Community meetings will provide opportunities for public input on Greer Stadium's future

Metro's plans for the future of the unused Greer Stadium property will be shaped by the community's vision and input – and Metro planners, along with Parks Department representatives and Councilman Colby Sledge, will discuss that vision with residents and property owners in the Greer Stadium neighborhood at two public meetings from **5:30 – 7 pm Wednesday, September 21, and 8:30 – 10 am Saturday, September 24**, at the Adventure Science Center, 800 Ft. Negley Blvd.

"Public input is critically important to this project," says Councilman Sledge. "We've heard a wide range of suggestions for the Greer property – what we're doing now is getting the best possible understanding of what the neighborhood wants this site to become. It's already clear that green space will definitely be a major part of the Greer property's future."

Greer Stadium and the surrounding parking lots are Metro Parks property, and city leaders anticipate a park-based discussion during the meetings. These discussions will contribute to the selection of an applicant who will contract with Metro to reimagine Greer; that selection is on track to be made by the end of this year, followed by a community planning process to shape the development proposal.
