The man arrested August 18 for two pharmacy robberies is under investigation for a third.

Parolee & convicted robber Roy Brown, 33, is charged with robbing two separate Walgreens locations on Saturday less than one hour apart, 3880 Dickerson Pike at 8 a.m. and 3130 Clarksville pike at 8:40 a.m.

Brown, of Bonnavale Drive, fled in a silver 1997 Buick LeSabre. One hour later, Hermitage Precinct Officer Brian Dugre stopped Brown who was driving recklessly with two flat tires on Old Hickory Boulevard near Anthony Street. Brown appeared to be extremely intoxicated. Inside his vehicle were multiple pill bottles taken during the second robbery.

Brown's photo is being withheld pending lineups in the August 11th robbery of the CVS pharmacy at 2516 Gallatin Avenue.

Brown is currently charged with two counts of robbery and DUI. He is being held in lieu of \$65,000 bond.

Brown was on parole for the 2008 robbery of a Charlotte Pike motel.

The Precinct News (Con't)

Information from citizens provided through Crime Stoppers was directly responsible for August 1st arrests of three persons in connection with last week's robbery of Pinnacle Bank's 4715 Andrew Jackson Parkway Branch during which a shot was fired.

Convicted felons Chad Warrick, 31, and Angela Camarda, 30, were taken into custody by members of the FBI's Violent Crimes Task Force and Madison Precinct officers during a vehicle stop at 7 p.m. at the intersection of Old Hickory Boulevard and Brick Church Pike. The couple had been under surveillance by Task Force members and a Metro police helicopter prior to their arrest. The third defendant, convicted felon Cynthia Heinz, 37, was arrested at her residence, 787 Clay Lick Court, in Northern Davidson County. Warrick and Camarda had also been staying there.

All three defendants are being formally charged with bank robbery in federal court. An appearance before a United States Magistrate has been set for 3:30 this afternoon. Additionally, Camarda was booked last night on an outstanding state parole violation warrant.

Warrick, Camarda and Heinz are alleged to have plotted together to commit the robbery. Warrick is accused of entering the bank wearing makeup on his face and hands and carrying a .45 caliber semi-automatic pistol. The robber demanded money and yelled, "No police." A 41-year-old bank employee who was eating lunch in a conference room adjacent to the lobby got up and looked out. The gunman saw her and she shut the conference room door. As she did so, the gunman fired one round into the door. The bullet lodged in a conference room wall and was recovered. The employee suffered an injury to her hand as she took cover.

After robbing the bank, Warrick is alleged to have fled in a light silver Pontiac Grand Prix, which was waiting in a nearby parking lot. Heinz is alleged to have been the getaway driver. The car was recovered from the Clay Lick Court residence Wednesday night. Camarda is alleged to have met with Warrick and Heinz in the Hermitage area before and after the robbery.

"The Nashville community, law enforcement and citizens alike, were very concerned about the violence and style of this makeup-wearing robber," Chief Steve Anderson said. "Since the robbery on Tuesday of last week, Crime Stoppers received nearly a dozen anonymous tips. In the end, that community involvement, combined with outstanding investigative work, led to these three persons being taken into custody."

"From bank robberies to serial rape defendants who have fled the United States, the Nashville area Violent Crimes Task Force has a track record of success in bringing accused violent criminals to justice," said Aaron T. Ford, Special Agent in Charge of the FBI's West & Middle Tennessee Division. "Having members of local law enforcement designated as special federal agents on the Task Force enhances investigations and the safety of our communities."

The criminal complaint being filed in this case is merely an accusation and not evidence of guilt. The defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty at trial, at which the United States government must bear the burden of proof.

Records reflect Warrick was convicted of two counts of aggravated robbery and felony drug possession in Wilson County. Heinz was convicted of multiple counts of obtaining drugs by fraud in DeKalb County, welfare fraud in Wilson County and theft in Davidson County. Camarda was convicted of two counts of forgery and obtaining drugs by fraud in Wilson County.

Proactive police work led to the August 16th arrest of two convicted felons a short time after they allegedly burglarized a Granny Wright Lane residence.

Hermitage Precinct Sergeant Jon McWright stopped the driver of a Nissan Altima on Smith Springs Parkway near Paddington Way for traveling 51 mph in a 30 mph zone. The driver, Kevin Thomas, 30, appeared to be extremely nervous and was shaking. Sergeant McWright began talking to him about his condition. During a consent search, unprescribed Xanax were located in his pocket. Thomas then admitted there were additional pills in the car. His passenger, Ronnie Garrett, 28, was also in possession of unprescribed medication. Seized during a subsequent probable cause search were a loaded .38 caliber pistol and a .22 caliber rifle.

Officers recognized other items in the vehicle that appeared out of place including silverware, computers and other electronics. A magazine with the address of the Granny Wright Lane residence was also recovered. When Sergeant McWright checked with the Emergency Communications Center he learned a burglary had just been reported at that address.

Thomas, of Monte Carlo Drive, and Garrett, of Colemont Court, are both charged with aggravated burglary, felon in possession of a weapon and felony drug possession.

Thomas is being held in lieu of \$70,000 bond. He has previous convictions for theft, statutory rape and evading arrest.

Garrett is being held in lieu of \$75,000 bond. He has previous convictions for aggravated burglary, burglary, theft and vehicle theft.



AN APPLICANT CAN GO DIRECTLY TO THE METRO GOVERNMENT WEB SITE AT WWW.NASHVILLE.GOV OR THERE IS A LINK TO APPLICATION PROCESS ON THE WWW.JOINMNPD.COM WEB SITE. FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS BELOW.

Each user must have a unique email address when setting up an account. Do not share your account with anyone. If you do not have an email account, you can sign up for a free account at Hotmail.com, Yahoo.com or Mail.com.

Employment Standards

- Two years (60 Semester hours) of general academic studies from an accredited college or university with an overall Grade Point Average of 2.0 ("C" Average) on a 4.0 scale. **Hours for remedial courses will not be counted. No more than two (2) transcripts will be evaluated. The cumulative hours and Grade Point Average (GPA) must appear on the transcript. Candidates must submit "official" transcripts that meet Metro's Educational Standards. At least one half of the total hours must be taken in residence, no more than half may be earned in non-traditional credits.** **OR** Applicant must have at least 2 years of active military duty and possess a high school diploma or GED. **Must not have been released or discharged under other than Honorable from any of the Armed Forces of the United States.** **OR** Applicants must have a high school diploma or GED and documentation of a minimum of 2 years full-time law enforcement experience in a patrol capacity with a certification from Tennessee P.O.S.T. or equivalent State certification board. **OR** Applicants must have a high school diploma or GED and have 5 years of responsible work experience. **AND**
 - Must be a minimum of 21 years of age. (May apply 2 (two) months prior to your 21st birthday).
 - The Distant Visual Acuity in each eye must be no worse than 20/100 (Snellen) uncorrected, corrected 20/20 in the better eye and 20/30 in the other eye. Binocular vision must be at 20 feet. Must have normal depth perception. Must have normal color vision.
 - Valid "Class D" Driver's License.
 - Citizen of the United States.
 - Have not been convicted of or pleaded guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere to any felony charge or to any violations of any federal or state laws or city ordinances relating to force, violence, theft, dishonesty, gambling, liquor or controlled substance.
 - Your driving record will be considered part of the background investigation for this position. Multiple offenses and/or chargeable accidents are grounds for disqualification or removal from the eligibility register.
 - Honorable discharge from Military Service (if applicable).
 - The medical requirements for enlistment or appointment to either the Army or Navy are the basis for physical suitability at the time of appointment.
- Meet standards set by the Tennessee Peace Officers Standards and Training Commission and adopted by the Tennessee General Assembly on June 24, 1983, T.C.A. 38-8-106.**

Previous Drug Use Criteria

- Marijuana use will be viewed in the context of the applicant's age at the time of use, the recency of use, and the frequency of use. No marijuana use will be allowed within 2 years of the date of the application.
 - No other illegal drug use within 7 years of application. Combined use of other drugs besides marijuana must not exceed 5 times.
 - No sale of any drugs.
 - Could have permanent disqualification for use of heroin, LSD, PCP, crack cocaine, and methamphetamine or similar substances.
 - Any prior drug use, admitted or discovered, will be evaluated in determining employment eligibility.
 - No pattern of abuse of legal or legend drugs (including steroids).
- Must pass polygraph or CVSA concerning use.**
