**Budget**

**Existing / Currently Funded at some level: Cost of Coordinated School Health Staff and School Nursing Staff, Screenings;**

**Not currently funded: Tar Wars straws and art supplies (approx. \$100 per school), CASTLES Full Time Coordinator and materials necessary for implementation (Scales, BMI instruments, pedometers, journals, etc – waiting on response from agency), funding for FACES and/or I.C. HOPE to provide a minimum of 2 programs per child at each Title 1 Elementary School (approximately \$60,000-\$80,000 would pay for the program coordinator, presenter, travel and materials).**
