Dear Park Patron,

Centennial Park has been improved with the help and hard work of many individuals and groups working together to contribute to the quality of life in this community. Please note that parking or driving on grass, except in designated areas, or on any other areas where parking would mar the landscape of the park, seriously damage tree roots, create a safety hazard, or interfere with the use of the park's facilities, is prohibited at all times.

The unauthorized use of the grass for parking and driving can and does result in a good deal of unsightly appearance and damages the green space which isn't designed to bear vehicle weight for an extended period of time. Inappropriate use of the park's green space also spoils the appearance of the park and causes the Parks Department unnecessary additional expense in repairing the damage. The enforcement of parking regulations in Centennial Park is not meant as an impediment to the enjoyment of the park; rather it's aimed toward the elimination of damage and hazards.

At each entrance to Centennial Park are signs that stipulate "*Park in Designated Parking Areas Only*". In Centennial Park proper there are 435 marked parking spaces. There is additional parking available during posted hours at the Centennial Sportsplex and there is also parking available around Centennial Park on Park Plaza, Brandau, 25th Ave. North and Patterson Ave.

Parking spaces and lots are clearly marked and it is everyone's responsibility to find a legal place to park. If you have questions, please feel free to call the Park Police Office at 880-3429.
