NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Presidential and State General Elections will be open and held in all one hundred sixty-nine (169) precincts in Davidson County, Tennessee on Tuesday, November 4, 2008, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

NOMINEES on the ballot will be elected to fill the following offices: President and Vice President; United States Senate; United States House of Representatives, Congressional Districts 5 and 7; Tennessee Senate, District 20, and Tennessee House of Representatives (Districts 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 58, 59, and 60). Independent Candidates for President and Vice President will appear on the ballot as well.

Also to be held are municipal elections in Belle Meade, Forest Hills and Goodlettsville.

THE QUALIFYING DEADLINE for candidates in each of these municipal elections is Thursday, August 21, 2008 at 12:00 Noon. Candidates should file nominating petitions with the Administrator of Elections at the Davidson County Election Commission.

THE WITHDRAWAL DEADLINE for candidates in each of these municipal elections is Thursday, August 28, 2008 at 12:00 Noon. Withdrawals must be in writing and signed by the candidate.

The **City of Belle Meade Election** will be for the election of either one (1) City Commissioner or three (3) City Commissioners. The number to be elected will depend upon a referendum also appearing on the ballot proposing to increase the number of City Commissioners from three (3) to five (5) through approval of an ordinance. The proposed ordinance in its entirety will be published in a subsequent notice pursuant to the provisions of T.C.A. 2-12-111(b).

The **City of Forest Hills Election** will be for the election of one (1) City Commissioner to serve a four year term.

The **City of Goodlettsville Election** will be for the election of three (3) Commissioners to serve four year terms on the Board of Commissioners.

THE LAST DAY TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN PERSON in the November 4, 2008 Election is Monday, October 6, 2008 at 4:30 p.m. Voter registration forms may be hand delivered to the Election Commission office by the close of business at 4:30 PM on Monday, October 6, 2008. The last day for a name change, address change, or to make any alteration to the voter registration record is Thursday, October 30, 2008. Applicants may register to vote in person at the Davidson County Election Commission or by using a Registration by Mail form available at any Post Office Branch location, Public Library Branch, or by visiting the Davidson County Election Commission website at: www.nashville.gov/vote to download the form. All Registration by Mail forms **MUST** be **POSTMARKED** no later than Monday, October 6, 2008. Voters who fail to change their address prior to election day may experience a delay in voting.

VOTERS WHO REGISTER TO VOTE BY-MAIL MUST VOTE IN PERSON THE FIRST TIME THEY VOTE EITHER AT THE POLL ON ELECTION DAY OR DURING EARLY VOTING.

THE DAVIDSON COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION OFFICE is located at 800 2nd Avenue South, Metro Office Building, Nashville, Tennessee. The office is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays and will be open for registration on the following Saturdays:

9:00 A.M. TO 12 NOON
OCTOBER 4, 2008
OPEN 8:00 A.M. TO 4:00 P.M.**

Pursuant to the provisions of T.C.A. 2-3-109, notice is given that if you are a disabled or elderly voter (65 or older) assigned to vote at an inaccessible polling place you have the option of voting on Election Day, November 4, 2008, at the Davidson County Election Commission Office. The Office is located in the Metro Office Building, 800 2nd Avenue S., Nashville, Tennessee.

Such voters who choose to vote at the Commission Office on Election Day must complete an affidavit at the Commission Office stating that their designated polling place is inaccessible. This affidavit must be received by the Election Commission no later than **October 25, 2008**.

Disabled or elderly voters also have the right to vote at the Election Commission Office during the early voting period or by absentee ballot pursuant to the provisions of T.C.A. 2-6-102, and 2-6-201-202. If, however, such voter has registered by mail they must appear in person to vote in the first election subsequent to their by mail registration. If information is needed on polling place accessibility, the definition of disabled, or absentee or early voting procedures, please contact the Davidson County Election Commission at 615- 862-8815 as soon as possible.
