NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT an election will be held on July 7, 2009, to fill three (3) positions for Commissioners for four-year terms for the City of Lakewood.

QUALIFYING DEADLINE FOR CANDIDATES IS THURSDAY, APRIL 16, 2009, at 12:00 NOON. Candidates should file nominating petitions with the Administrator of Elections, Davidson County Election Commission, Metro Office Building, 800 2nd AV S, Nashville, Tennessee.

WITHDRAWAL DEADLINE FOR CANDIDATES to remove his or her name from the ballot is **THURSDAY, APRIL 23, 2009, at 12:00 NOON.** The request to withdraw must be in writing, signed by the candidate and filed with the Davidson County Election Commission.

LAST DAY TO REGISTER IN PERSON TO VOTE in this election is **MONDAY, JUNE 8, 2009, at 4:30 P.M.** Applicants may register to vote at the Davidson County Election Commission or by using a Registration By-Mail application available at any Post Office or Public Library Branch. These forms may be delivered no later than Monday, June 8, 2009, or if mailed, postmarked by Monday, June 8, 2009. The last day to make a name change, address change or to make any alteration to a registration record will be **Thursday, July 2, 2009 at 4:30 p.m.**

DAVIDSON COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION OFFICE HOURS are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The office is located at 800 2nd Avenue South, Nashville, TN 37210.

**NOTICE
VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES AND ELDERLY
VOTERS**

Pursuant to the provisions of T.C.A. 2-3-109, notice is given that if you are a disabled or elderly voter (65 or older) assigned to vote at an inaccessible polling place, you have the option of voting on election day, July 7, 2009, at the Davidson County Election Commission office.

Such voters who choose to vote at the commission office on election day must complete an affidavit at the commission office stating that their designated polling place is inaccessible. This affidavit must be received by the Election Commission no later than June 27, 2009.

Disabled or elderly voters also have the right to vote at the Election Commission Office during the early voting period or by absentee ballot. If, however, such voter has registered by mail they must appear in person to vote in the first election subsequent to their by-mail registration. If information is needed on polling place accessibility, the definition of disabled or absentee or early voting procedures, please contact the Davidson County Election Commission at 615-862-8815.
