



Helpful Tips for Reuniting Found Pets

Have you found a lost pet in Davidson County? Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and Executive Order 3 in Davidson County, Metro Animal Care & Control is limited to providing essential services to facilitate social distancing and respond to public safety and animal welfare emergencies. Therefore, citizens may be successful in reuniting lost pets by following these steps and limiting their movement around town.

- Check the animal for an ID tag or rabies vaccine tag or phone number inscribed on the collar. If the pet is wearing a rabies tag, call the phone number on the tag and have the tag number available.
- File a FOUND report on PetHarbor.com. This website connects to the shelter database and our staff are diligently cross-checking lost and found reports to find matches.
- Post on applicable Lost & Found Pet Facebook groups in Nashville (list on MACC website at <https://www.nashville.gov/Health-Department/Animal-Care-and-Control/Lost-and-Found-Resources/Facebook-Lost-and-Found-Groups.aspx>)

- Post a FOUND report on Pawboost.com. This free resource also connects with Facebook.
- Post details and a photo of the pet on the NextDoor app to reach your surrounding neighbors.
- Post a photo on the Finding Rover facial recognition website or app.
- Take the pet to a nearby veterinary clinic for a microchip scan, which can be completed in the parking lot or curbside.
- Create flyers or posters with a photo of the found pet to post on nearby streets and intersections. Include your phone number so the owner can reach you.
- Contact MACC directly for delivery of a FOUND DOG yard sign and pet food/supplies that you may need to care for the pet in your home. Call 615-862-7928 or email maccomplaint@nashville.gov.
