Introduction to BRFSS

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) is a state-based system of health surveys that collects information on health risk behaviors, preventive health practices, and health care access primarily related to chronic disease and injury. For many states, the BRFSS is the only available source of timely, accurate data on health-related behaviors (<http://www.cdc.gov/brfss/about.htm>). In Davidson County, a variety of funding opportunities over the years have made it possible to collect enough data so that analysis can be done at the county level. Most recently, this survey was funded as part of the Communities Putting Prevention to Work initiative. The data collection was conducted by the Tennessee Department of Health for the Metro Public Health Department. The survey data were gathered by telephone from September 2010 through February 2011. It should be noted that the phone numbers used to collect these data were restricted to land lines. Given that 37.5% of Davidson County adults live in households that only have cell phones, this may make the results less reflective of the actual community (Blumberg et al, 2011). The raw data gathered by this survey were disproportionately female, older, and non-Hispanic. The Hispanic population is underrepresented. Data were collected to identify respondents of Hispanic ethnicity, but the number of respondents was too small for analysis.

The demographic characteristics of the 1,414 respondents are as follows:

Below are a series of tables that present the responses to selected survey questions by demographic categories. For each response option, the number of respondents, the corresponding percent, and the 95% confidence interval are included.

When the total number of respondents for any given demographic division was less than 50, the percentages and confidence intervals were considered unstable and therefore omitted. Likewise, if a confidence interval had a range greater than 20, it was omitted. Occasionally, due to low response rates, the employment and marital status categories were collapsed to present a more accurate depiction of respondents.

Survey Results Highlights

The following are some highlights from the survey responses.

Health status

- Over half (53.7%) of respondents identified their general health as ‘excellent’ or ‘very good.’
- Income appears to be directly related to higher ratings of one’s general health. Only 10.2% of respondents reporting less than \$25,000 in annual income reported that their general health was ‘excellent’ compared to 34.1% among those reporting an income of at least \$75,000.
- Likewise, education also appears to be directly related to respondents’ general health status. Only 6.5% of respondents with less than a high school education reported their health to be ‘excellent’ compared to 26.5% of respondents who graduated college or a technical school.

Health care access

- A large majority of respondents (92.1%) reported having some sort of health care coverage. This is in contrast to the 2010 American Community Survey (ACS) where 18.2% of Davidson County residents were determined to be uninsured. It should be noted too that the ACS may be more accurate as it includes all households regardless of telephone type.
- Most respondents (88.4%) identify one person as their personal doctor or health care provider.
- Having a single individual one can identify as his/her personal doctor is more common among females than males and non-Hispanic white respondents than non-Hispanic blacks.
- Among the youngest respondents (18-44 years old) 19.8% reported that they do not have a personal doctor.
- The large majority (84.2%) of respondents reported having a routine check-up within the past year.
- Annual routine check-ups appear to be more common among females (87.0%) compared to males (78.6%) and non-Hispanic blacks (88.4%) compared to non-Hispanic whites (83.0%).

Cardiovascular disease prevalence

- Less than 1 in 10 respondents reported that he/she had ever had a heart attack (6.2%), coronary heart disease (6.6%), or a stroke (6.1%).
- Each of these diagnoses was more common among males than females.
- Non-Hispanic whites more commonly reported heart attacks and coronary heart disease while non-Hispanic blacks were more likely to report having had a stroke.

Cardiovascular disease prevalence (continued)

- As a respondent's educational attainment increased, their report of ever being diagnosed as having had a heart attack, coronary heart disease, or a stroke decreased. Among respondents with less than a high school education, 15.7% reported a heart attack compared to 4.7% of respondents who graduated from college or a technical school. Likewise, the corresponding percentages for these groups were 12.0% and 5.7% for a coronary heart disease diagnosis and 15.7% and 3.8% for a stroke diagnosis respectively.

Diabetes

- Being diagnosed with diabetes was reported by 14.8% with an additional 0.7% reporting gestational diabetes.
- Diabetes was more common among males and non-Hispanic black respondents.
- Income and having received a diabetes diagnosis were inversely related.

Tobacco use

- Roughly 1 in 6 (16.2%) respondents reported that they were current smokers.
- Just over a quarter (25.3%) of the respondents were former smokers.
- Males were more likely to be current smoker compared to females (19.0% vs. 14.9%).
- Non-Hispanic blacks (17.6%) reported being current smokers more frequently than non-Hispanic whites (15.8%) did.
- Respondents ages 18-44 were 1.6 times more likely to be current smokers than those who were 65 or older.
- Smokeless tobacco use was reported by 1.8% of the respondents. Males were reported smokeless tobacco use 3.1 times more often than females. Likewise, smokeless tobacco use was reported by 4.6% of respondents with less than a high school education compared to just 1.4% of those with at least some college or technical school education.

Fruit and Vegetable Consumption

- The large majority (86.4%) of survey respondents reported consuming fruits and vegetables less than 5 times a day.
- Consuming fruits and vegetables less than once a day was reported by 8.0% of the respondents.

Menu labeling

- Over one-third (35.7%) of the respondents never use calorie information on menus to help them decide what to order.
- Roughly 1 in 10 (10.6%) of the survey respondents reported that they never noticed or never looked for the calorie information on a menu.
- About 1 in 5 (20.3%) males reported using calorie information to help them make their ordering decisions 'most of the time' compared to 31.1% of the female respondents.
- There was relatively little difference by race/ethnicity with 28.5% of non-Hispanic whites and 24.9% of non-Hispanic blacks reporting the use of calorie information on menus 'most of the time'.

Menu labeling (continued)

- The use of calorie information increased with income and education. Among those making less than \$25,000 a year, 24.6% reported using the information to help inform their decisions ‘most of the time’ compared to 35.9% of those earning more than \$75,000. Likewise, 17.2% of respondents with less than a high school education reported using the calorie information ‘most of the time’ compared to 32.8% of those who graduated from college or a technical school.

Disability

- Nearly one-quarter (24.5%) of all respondents reported having some limitations due to physical, mental or emotional problems.
- Income seems to be inversely related to disability. Over one-third (36.6%) of the respondents earning less than \$25,000 annually have some physical, mental, or emotional limitations compared to 14.7% of those earning over \$75,000 each year.
- A striking 71.6% of respondents who are unable to work reported that they do have some limitations due to physical, mental, or emotional problems.

Physical activity

- Over one-third (36.4%) of the survey respondent reported no kind of physical activity during the month prior to the survey. This is on par with the baseline percentage of Healthy People 2020, where the goal is to reduce the proportion of adults who have no leisure-time physical activity to 32.6%.
- For respondents who reported some leisure-time physical activity, walking was the most common activity with 62.5% reporting that they participate in this activity. Rounding out the top 10 most common leisure time activities were: running, aerobics video or class, gardening, calisthenics, bicycling, weight lifting, riding a stationary bike, dancing, and golfing (while using a golf cart).
- When looking at physical activity by employment status, employed respondents were the most active with 29.6% reporting no physical activity in the month prior to the survey compare to as much as 58.9% among those unable to work.
- Being married or a member of an unmarried couple had a positive impact on physical activity with 66.9% reporting that they were physically active the month prior to the survey compared to other marital status groups where the report of no activity was as high as 45.8% among those who had been widowed.

Secondhand smoke

- Only 120 (8.8%) respondents reported someone smoking in their home in the week prior to the survey.
- 118 (8.7%) respondents reported riding in a car with someone who was smoking in the week prior to the survey.
- 140 (10.4%) respondents reported breathing smoke in a public place due to someone else smoking.
- Just over three-quarters (75.6%) of respondents think that smoking indoors at a workplace should never be allowed.

Smoking cessation

- 15.3% of the survey respondents were aware of the quit line services availability.
- 13.5% of respondents who reported trying to quit smoking reported using any sort of service to assist them during their last attempt.
- Only 14.2% of respondents reported that they received one-on-one counseling from a health professional to help them quit smoking.
- Over one quarter (27%) reported the use of medication the last time they tried to quit smoking.
- Nearly one-third (29.2%) do report having a specific timeframe in mind for quitting smoking.

Emotional support and life satisfaction

- Males are more likely than females to report that they ‘rarely or never’ get the emotional support they need (10.4% vs. 6.3%). Similarly, non-Hispanic blacks are more likely to report that they ‘rarely or never’ get the emotional support they need compared to non-Hispanic whites (10.4% vs. 6.5%).
- ‘Rarely or never’ getting the emotional support one needs was most commonly reported by respondents who were unable to work (11.6%), those who were divorced/separated (12.1%), those making less than \$25,000 (12.4%), and those with less than a high school education (19.4%).

Mental/Emotional Health Symptoms

- Feeling nervous ‘most of the time’ in the month prior to the survey was most commonly reported by respondents making less than \$25,000 (14.2%), those with less than a high school education (14.0%), and those who reported that they were unable to work (36.7%).
- Having a feeling of hopelessness ‘most of the time’ was most commonly reported among respondents who were either unemployed (8.6%) or those unable to work (6.8%).
- Experiencing a feeling of restlessness or being fidgety ‘most of the time’ was most commonly reported among respondents with less than a high school education (18.4%) and those unable to work (26.1%).
- Feeling so depressed that nothing could cheer you up ‘most of the time’ was most commonly reported by respondents who were unable to work (14.9%) or unemployed (5.2%). Having social companionship by being married or a member of an unmarried couple may help alleviate such feelings as only 1.6% of these respondents reported similar feelings ‘most of the time’.
- Similar to experiencing times of feeling depressed, respondents who were unable to work (22.9%) or unemployed (15.5%) felt that everything was an effort ‘most of the time’. Having social companionship by being married or a member of an unmarried couple may help alleviate such feelings as only 5.7% of these respondents reported similar feelings ‘most of the time’.
- A feeling for worthlessness was reported ‘most of the time’ by 8.2% of the respondents who were unable to work, and 5.2% who have less than a high school education.

Food assistance

- Just under 1 in 10 (7.5%) of respondents reported that someone in their household had received WIC in the past year.
- Non-Hispanic black respondents were 2.1 times more likely to report someone in the household receiving WIC in the past year than were non-Hispanic white respondents.
- Among respondents with less than a high school education, 16.5% of the respondents reported that someone in their house was eligible for WIC in the year prior to the survey.

Neighborhood perception and environment

- Just over half (50.4%) of respondents believe their neighborhood is a ‘very pleasant’ place to walk.
- As respondents’ income increased so did their perception that their neighborhood was ‘very pleasant’. Among those earning less than \$25,000 a year, 41.0% rated their neighborhood this way compared to 70.7% of respondents who earned \$75,000 or more. Likewise, 31.5% of respondents with less than a high school education said their neighborhood was ‘very pleasant’ compared to 61.5% of respondents who graduated from college or a technical school.
- Walking in one’s neighborhood for leisure or as a way to get to a destination for 11 or more days in the past month was reported by 17.5% of respondents with an additional 49.0% reporting that they never walk in their neighborhood.
- Only 1 in 5 (21.8%) survey respondents indicated that their neighborhood is ‘extremely safe’.
- Non-Hispanic whites are 1.7 times more likely than non-Hispanic blacks to consider their neighborhoods ‘extremely safe’.
- When asked the number one reason for not walking more in the neighborhood, 42.3% of the respondents cited ‘environmental conditions’ such as the weather, nowhere to go, no sidewalks, too much traffic and safety. Nearly one-quarter (24.3%) said they lacked time to walk and another 22.6% said they have a medical condition that prevents them from walking or they lack the energy/motivation. Getting exercise elsewhere was the reason given by 10.9% of the respondents.

Perceived nutrition environment and policy

- Just over half (50.9%) of the survey respondents indicated that they ‘strongly agree’ with a statement that indicates it is easy to buy healthy food in one’s neighborhood.
- The majority of non-Hispanic whites (55.8%) agreed with such a statement compared to just 38.4% of non-Hispanic blacks.
- Among those respondents making more the \$75,000 a year, 68.1% ‘strongly agree’ that it is easy to purchase healthy food in their neighborhood.

Tobacco offers

- Of the survey respondents who reported smoking ‘everyday’ or ‘some days’, the decision to take advantage of money-saving offers on tobacco products is roughly evenly distributed (31.6% ‘never’ take advantage of offers; 34.2% take advantage of offers ‘often’ or every time they see them).

Water consumption (tap, bottled, unflavored sparkling)

- Water consumption was not very popular. Only 12.2% of respondents reported that they drank 8 oz. of water ‘4 or more times per day’.

Body Mass Index

- The BMI is either unknown, could not be determined, or indicated that 92 respondents (6.5%) were underweight. The following percentages reflect calculations based on those with complete information.
- Nearly one-third (32.0%) of all survey respondents were classified as overweight.
- An additional 26.2% of all respondents were classified as obese.
- Males were more likely to be overweight, but females were more commonly obese.
- Non-Hispanic blacks were more often overweight or obese than non-Hispanic whites.
- While there are socioeconomic variations in weight status, except for homemakers/students, no category had the majority of people at a healthy weight.
