

Fire of 1916

On March 22, 1916, a fire broke out in Edgefield that went on to destroy 648 buildings in East Nashville. The lots between Woodland St., Russell St., S 6th St., and S 8th St. were damaged so extensively that, rather than attempt to rebuild, the area was turned into a park, today known as East Park. One notable survivor of the fire is the "gargoyle" house on Russell St., known for the gothic creature in stone perched atop the roof.
