

East Park Community Center

Nashville Street Railway

Electric streetcars became a popular way to travel within Nashville during the late 1880s. At first, there were several different lines linking the suburban areas of Nashville to the city center, but in 1890 many of these were consolidated by the United Electric Railway Co. and collectively called the Nashville Street Railway. From 1903-1914, the streetcar system was run by the Nashville Railway and Light Company, which was presided over by industrialist Percy Warner (after whom the park in Belle Meade is named). After a succession of owners, the Nashville transit system phased out streetcars by the early 1940s.
