

Lockeland Springs

Col. Robert Weakley built the first mansion in this area northeast of Nashville in the early 1800s, and named his estate "Lockeland" after the family of his wife, Jane Locke Weakley. The spring itself was the source of water for Lockeland estate, and the water would eventually be awarded with a prize for its quality at the St. Louis Exposition in 1904. Since then, the area evolved into one of Nashville's early streetcar suburbs, and today is a quiet residential neighborhood filled with pleasant bungalows and handsome churches. Lockeland Springs is considered to be bounded by Shelby Ave to the south, Shelby Park to the east, Eastland Ave to the north, and Gallatin Pike and S 14th St to the west.
