


The Formation of Fisk University

During the Civil War, the hill upon which Fisk University sits today (the highest point in Nashville) was a Confederate fort. Upon its capture by Union troops, it was used as an army barracks until after the war had ended, at which point General Clinton B. Fisk donated the land and barracks to create the Fisk Free Colored School for the education of freedmen. Within a year of its founding, the school was incorporated as a normal University for the training of teachers and saw its enrollment rise from about 200 to over 600.
