


Know Your Community

Data and Maps from Metropolitan Social Services

In June 2016, Metropolitan Social Services released the first ***Know Your Community***, featuring data about each of the 35 Metropolitan Council Districts. This data is objective – from the U. S. Census Bureau’s American Community Survey and covers an array of topics. The data is also the most recent available, using the 2011-2015 American Community Survey which was released by the U. S. Census Bureau in December 2016 (the next update will be released in December 2017).

The 2016 release event featured Vice Mayor David Briley and representatives of Metropolitan Social Services and the Neighborhoods Resource Center, community leaders gathered to learn more about the people who live in Davidson County’s 35 Metropolitan Council Districts.



Metropolitan Social Services is pleased to present the second annual edition of ***Know Your Community***. The data in this report can be used by the residents who live in each of the Metro Council Districts, as well as by the 40 Council Members who have been elected to serve the people who live in Davidson County. Maps also visually demonstrate the distribution of characteristics across the Metropolitan Government area.

Know Your Community

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Definitions from the U. S. Census Bureau

Age – The American Community Survey provides population age breakdowns into various categories. This document reflects the percent of Davidson County residents who are age 18 and over, 21 and over, 62 and over and 65 and over, along with the total population.

Civilian labor force is the sum of civilian (not in the armed forces) employed and unemployed persons.

Contract Rent is also called Rent Asked, and is the amount a housing unit currently costs to rent, without utilities or other housing expenses.

Cost Burdened Homeowner - A homeowner household is Cost Burdened if housing costs are over 30% of household income. For owner housing costs, the ACS uses the sum of mortgage payments (if applicable), home equity loans, real estate taxes; insurance, utilities, and heating/cooling fuels. Severe Cost Burden means housing costs are 50% or more of household income.

Cost Burdened Renter - A renter household is Cost Burdened when monthly Gross Rent (which includes utilities) is over 30% of monthly household income. Severe Cost Burden means housing costs are 50% or more of household income.

Disability Status - The American Community Survey questions introduced in 2008 focus on the presence of specific types of disabilities, in 5 categories:

- Hearing difficulty: deaf or having serious difficulty hearing
- Vision difficulty: blind or having serious difficulty seeing, even when wearing glasses
- Cognitive difficulty: Because of a physical, mental, or emotional problem, having difficulty remembering, concentrating, or making decisions
- Ambulatory difficulty: Having serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs.
- Self-care difficulty: Having difficulty bathing or dressing
- Independent living difficulty: Because of a physical, mental, or emotional problem, having difficulty doing errands alone such as visiting a doctor's office or shopping

Educational Attainment – the highest degree or level of school completed. This is distinct from the level of school an individual is attending (shown in enrollment). Includes data for those

without a high school education, with a high school education, Bachelor's degree, graduate or professional degree.

Employed – did any work at all as paid employees during the week in which the survey is conducted; worked in their own business, profession, or on their own farm; or worked without pay at least 15 hours in a family business or farm. Also includes people who were temporarily absent from their jobs because of illness, bad weather, vacation, labor-management disputes, or personal reasons.

Ethnicity – Ethnicity is in two categories identified by the U. S. Government, Hispanic/Latino or Not Hispanic/Latino.

Family – A family consists of two or more people (one of whom is the householder) related by birth, marriage, or adoption residing in the same housing unit.

Family / Household Structure - describes living arrangements that include family households, married households, male and female households, families and average size of families/households.

Family Income Categories – The American Community Survey provides family income in various categories. This table reflects the percentage of Davidson County families making from incomes under \$15,000 a year to over \$150,000.

Family Income is the amount of income generated by the people who compose a family (living together and related by blood or marriage).

Foreign-born – anyone who is not a U.S. citizen at birth. World Regions of Birth are categorized as Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, Northern America and Oceania.

Full-Time, Year-Round Workers are all people 16 years old and over who usually worked 35 hours or more per week for 50 to 52 weeks in the past 12 months.

Gross rent includes rent plus estimated costs of utilities and heating/cooling fuels.

Household – A household consists of all people who occupy a housing unit regardless of relationship. A household may consist of a person living alone or multiple unrelated individuals or families living together.

Housing units are any place people normally live, including single-family homes, condominiums, apartments, and trailers.

Languages Spoken – The U.S. Census Bureau uses the term languages spoken at home to refer to the language reported by survey respondents about whether they speak English only at home or speak a non-English language. Respondents who indicate they "Speak English less than very

well” refers to households in which no one above the age of 14 speaks English very well and may be considered to have Limited English Proficiency.

Margin of Error describes the range in which the true value may be – For example, 20 +/- 10 means that the true value may be anything from 10 to 30. The smaller the margin of error, the closer the reported value will be to the true value. The U. S. Census Bureau provides specific margins of errors for each type of data, but these are not included in this report on Council Districts.

Mean income is calculated by dividing the aggregate of all incomes reported by the population described by the total number of that population.

Median / Mean Income / Source – The American Community Survey not only documents the mean and median incomes of households but also the source of this income. This table reflects the median household income in Davidson County and the mean incomes from Social Security, retirement, Supplemental Security Income, and cash from public assistance income.

Median Income – the level of income where ½ (one-half) of the defined population is below that level and ½ (one-half) above the median. This is used to classify household and family income levels.

Native born – anyone born in the United States, Puerto, or a U.S. Island Area, or those born abroad of at least one U.S. citizen parent.

Nonfamily Income – income generated by either an individual who lives alone or lives with others who are not related by blood or marriage.

Occupied housing units are the usual place where someone resides.

Owner Valuation - For Value of homes, the American Community Survey uses the owner’s estimate of how much the home would sell for if it were for sale. For vacant units, value is the price asked for the property.

Owner-occupied are housing units that are owned by the person living there.

Per Capita Income - Per capita income is the mean income computed for every man, woman, and child in a particular group including those living in group quarters. It is derived by dividing the aggregate income of a particular group by the total population in that group.

Poverty – Poverty is measured by the U. S. Census Bureau, based on a decades-old formula that considers only cash income and the number of people in the household. Poverty Guidelines are updated each year and are used to determine the eligibility for federally-funded programs. For the contiguous 48 states, people are considered in poverty when their income is below the following 2016 guidelines by number in the household: 1 = \$11,880; 2 = \$16,020; 3 = \$20,160; 4

= \$24,300; 5 = \$28,440; 6 = \$32,580; 7 = \$36,730; 8 = \$40,890. A Supplemental Poverty Measure was developed in recent years and is being used for research, and considers additional types of income as well as necessary expenditures for health, employment, etc.

Race – Race is divided by the U. S. Government into five specific categories – White; Black or African American; American Indian and Alaska Native; Asian; and Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander. It also includes the distribution into the categories of Some Other Race and Two or More Races.

Renter-occupied housing units are those not owned by the person living there who pays the owner for occupancy.

School Enrollment – includes reports on data about people who report being enrolled in a regular school (one that advances a person toward an elementary school certificate, a high school diploma, or a college, university or professional school (such as law or medicine) degree.

Type of Employer – Civilians age 16 and over are categorized by the type of employer or class of worker, reflecting the type of ownership of the employing organization. The class of worker is categorized into Private wage and salary workers, Government workers, Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers, and Unpaid family workers.

Unemployed – if they had no employment during the week in which the survey is conducted; were also available for work at that time; and they made specific efforts to find employment sometime during the 4-week period ending with the reference week.

Vacant units are those where no one is living at Census time.

Worker Earnings - the sum of wage or salary income and net income from self-employment. An individual with earnings is one who has either wage/salary income or self-employment income, or both. The American Community Survey provides data by categories including gender and full or part time work.


Workforce Status – reported for people age 16 and over and includes the civilian labor force who are classified as Employed or Unemployed.


Median Age by Council Districts Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)




White Population by Council Districts Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)


Black or African American Population by Council Districts Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)








Age 25 and Over Without a High School Education by Council Districts Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)




**School Enrollees in Elementary School (Grades 1-8) by Council Districts




Percent with Disabilities by Council Districts Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)






Households Including Age 65 or More by Council Districts Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)






Per Capita Income by Council Districts Davidson County, 2011-2015






Median Worker Earnings by Council Districts Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)






Percent of Poverty for All People by Council District Davidson County, 2011-2015






Median Housing Owner Valuation by Council Districts Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)




Single Unit Detached Structures by Council District Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)


Structures Built With 20 or More Units by Council District Davidson County, Tennessee (2011-2015)


