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NASHVILLE BUSINESSES DO THEIR PART TO CONSERVE **Residents and Businesses still urged to limit water use**

Nashville, Tenn. - Many Nashville businesses have taken extraordinary measures to conserve water since the voluntary water conservation request was made by Mayor Dean. These conservation measures will help ensure that Nashville continues to have an ample supply of water for essential services until the water supply in Nashville is more assured. Below are just a few examples:

The Pinnacle at Symphony Place – 150 3rd Ave S. – 615.504.4122

The Pinnacle is giving Nashville residents access to non-potable water for uses such as cleaning and watering of plants during the drinking water crisis. The Pinnacle has made both a fire hose fitting as well as a Camlock fitting available for the filling of water tanks. (These fittings are not suitable for small containers such as milk jugs or pitchers.) The non-potable water will be available at 1st and Demonbreun until quantities diminish. (access from Gateway Bridge to 1st Ave, and right 2 blocks to Demonbruen)

The US Smokeless Tobacco – 800 Harrison St. – 615.880.4422

USST has taken a number of actions to conserve water usage in their factory including:

- Using only bottled drinking water since Monday,
- Receiving delivery of port-a-lets on Wednesday for use by our employees on site,
- Using disposable plates and flatware in our company cafeteria,
- Switching to tanked in water, effective this morning, to support 100% of our facility needs.

Hillwood Country Club – 6201 Hickory Valley Road – 615.352.6591

The Club cut back on all water usage starting by taking these steps, among others:

- Cut laundry use significantly (no towels on carts)
- Switched to recyclable paper plates and utensils
- Stopped irrigating clay courts and golf courses except with well water
- Eliminated washing of the range balls
- Bottled water supplied at tennis & golf
