SECTION II. MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE REGIONAL PLANNING BOARD MEMBERS

T.C.A. 68-211-813 (b) states that each Region must have a board that shall consist of **an odd number of members**, **not less than five nor more than fifteen**. Each county that is a member of the Region must be represented by at least one member. Municipalities that provide solid waste services either directly or by contract shall be represented on the board. Municipalities entitled to representation may agree to be represented jointly by a board member.

The members of the board shall serve for terms of six (6) years or until their successors are elected and are qualified by taking an oath of office, except that the initial board shall have approximately one-third (1/3) of the members with terms of two (2) years, and approximately one-third (1/3) of the members with terms of four (4) years, so as to stagger the terms of office.

Appointments made after July 1, 1994, to the board for a municipal solid waste region consisting of counties having a population less than two hundred thousand (200,000) according to the 1990 federal census or any subsequent federal census shall be made so that rural landowners shall have representation on the board, and by December 31, 1998, at least thirty percent (30%) of the membership shall consist of members who own at least a fifty percent (50%) equitable or fee simple interest in land that is eligible for classification as agricultural, forest or open space land under the terms of the Agricultural, Forest and Open Space Land Act of 1976, as amended.

D. Tennessee Recycling Report for 2004

Effective January 1, 1996, each county must provide, directly or by contract, one or more sites for the collection of recyclable materials, unless an adequate site is otherwise available [T.C.A. § 68-211-863]. If the Region contracts with a private recycling firm to fulfill the requirements, include a letter from that firm to the County Executive indicating a willingness to provide this service. The letter should state that the facility is available to <u>all</u> county citizens and should also include a list of the materials which will be accepted.

The Region shall provide copies of the Tennessee Recycling Report to each collection facility for completion. Each commercial and industrial in-house recycling program shall complete the Tennessee Recycling Report for 2003. Each County, Municipality and Non-Profit shall complete one report to include information for all programs under their control. (i.e. city or county schools, convenience center collection sites, etc.)

CHAPTER 6. WASTE COLLECTION AND TRANSPORTATION

As of January 1, 1996, each county in the Region was required to assure adequate collection [T.C.A. § 68-211-851] to meet the needs of its citizens. Per the statute, green boxes (unattended dumpsters) may not be used to assure minimum collection efforts.

According to Tennessee Regulations 1200-1-7-.10, the minimum level of solid waste collection services for a county shall be assured through the use of convenience centers or a higher level of service (household collection).

CHAPTER 13 FLOW CONTROL

commissioner:

TCA 68-211-814(b) (1) (A) states that if the commissioner approves the plan, the region or solid waste authority, if one has been formed pursuant to part 9 of this chapter, by resolution and subsequent adoption of ordinances by counties and municipalities in the region, may also regulate the flow of collected municipal solid waste generated within the region. Prior to the adoption of any resolution declaring the necessity of requiring mandatory flow of municipal solid waste, the region or authority, following one (1) or more public hearings, shall demonstrate in writing to the commissioner that it has considered the utilization of any municipal solid waste management facility in existence within the region on July 1, 1991, which meets the proposed or final federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Subtitle D regulations. The region or authority must show that its decision not to use the existing facility is based on the fact that:

- (i) Such facility is environmentally unsound or inadequate to meet the region's ten-year capacity assurance plan;
- (ii) (a) Costs for the use of such facility are inconsistent with comparable facilities within the state; or
- (b) The existing facility is operating in a manner that is inconsistent with the plan; and
- (iii) The waste subject to flow control will be sent only to a facility or facilities that meet all state and federal regulations.
- (B) The region or authority may restrict access to any landfills and incinerators which dispose of municipal solid waste by excluding waste originating with persons or entities outside the region in order to effectuate the plan. If a facility within a region has accepted waste from a specific source outside the region prior to July 1, 1991, the region may not prohibit that facility from continuing to accept waste from that source, unless the facility's acceptance of that waste significantly impairs the region's ability to effectuate its plan.
