

RESOLUTION NO. RS2018-1108

A resolution amending the contract between the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Department of Public Works, and the Nashville Downtown Partnership, to add the Metro Howard Complex Parking Garage to the public parking facilities managed by the Nashville Downtown Partnership.

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County (“Metro”) owns certain public parking facilities in the downtown Nashville area; and,

WHEREAS, BL2017-709 approved a contract between Metro and the Nashville Downtown Partnership for the management of the Church Street Garage and the Public Square Garage; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the amended contract (the “Amended Contract”) attached hereto as Exhibit A, and incorporated herein by reference, Metro proposes to add the Metro Howard Complex Parking Garage and Surface Parking lot located at 806 Second Avenue South to the public parking facilities managed by the Nashville Downtown Partnership; and,

WHEREAS, the Amended Contract also delegates the operation and management of the bike share initiative, Nashville B-Cycle, and right-of-way landscaping maintenance to the Downtown Partnership; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to BL2017-709 amendments to the Contract may be approved by resolution of the Metropolitan Council receiving at least 21 affirmative votes; and,

WHEREAS, approval of the Amended Contract is in the best interest of the citizens of Nashville and Davidson County.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:**

Section 1. The Amended Contract between the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Department of Public Works, and the Nashville Downtown Partnership (Exhibit A) is hereby approved and the Director of Public Works or his designee is authorized to execute the Contract.

Section 2. Any amendment to the Contract may be approved by resolution of the Metropolitan Council receiving at least 21 affirmative votes.

Section 3. That this Resolution shall take effect from and after is final passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.
