

RESOLUTION NO. RS2018-1435 (VERCHER & FREEMAN) – This resolution would approve an intergovernmental agreement between the United States Marshals Service (USMS) and the Metropolitan Nashville Police Department (MNPD) to investigate and apprehend local, state, and federal fugitives. The task force operations are supported in part by the U.S. Department of Justice’s Asset Forfeiture Fund through the Joint Law Enforcement Operations (JLEO) Program.

The memorandum of understanding provides that the Metro Police Department will be reimbursed, to the extent federal funds are available, for participating officers’ overtime costs.

The term of the MOU is for the duration of the task force’s operations, but may be terminated by either party with 30 days’ written notice.

The Council is authorized to approve by resolution intergovernmental agreements with federal agencies under Tennessee’s Interlocal Cooperation Act, Tenn. Code Ann. §12-9-101, *et seq.*

Fiscal Note: Depending on the amount of available funds, the USMS would reimburse the Metro Police Department for their expenses while participating in the Task Force. This could include overtime, travel, training, purchase or lease of police vehicles, fuel, supplies, equipment, and payment of informants.
