DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This investment will expand capabilities, sustainment of and enhance the response and application of resources for Tennessee Homeland Security District 5. While Tennessee Task Force 2 (TNTF2) Urban Search and Rescue Team, established in 1995, is based in Davidson County, it is also a statewide response asset. The Nashville Fire Department Hazmat Team (Type I) will benefit by expanding capabilities, sustainment and enhancement of response and application of resources for Hazmat and WMD threat related incidents by increasing its capability of air sampling and detection devices. TNTF2, as well as other specialized teams throughout the district, have worked diligently over the past 8 years to prepare specialized capabilities to respond to emergency events of all scopes and magnitude. These teams have attended training and exercises, both locally and nationally, to gain knowledge, skill and ability to work in numerous types of environments. The response equipment will provide a safe and efficient response for citizens and responders locally and across the region. This, in turn, would expedite the mitigation and recovery process for the whole community.

Objectives:

Establish a statewide wireless communications system including 800 MHz "trunked" voice and 700 MHz mobile data capability to enable all agencies within the State to communicate in an interoperable manner.

DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Homeland Security District 5 (HSD5) sub-committee of Communications is proposing the expenditure of HSD5 funds for 2 back-up generators for emergency power to HSD5 funded tower sites in Sumner County. The Sumner County investment is \$20,396. The expenditure of funds for Cannon County in interoperability communications with a microwave shot between two towers, one VHF repeater (P25 capable) and three VHF receivers (P25 capable) at various locations in the county. The Cannon County investment is \$57,189. The expenditure of funds to Wilson County is for 25 VHF P25 portable radios for interoperability communications. The Wilson County investment is \$23,750. The expenditures of funds to City of Gallatin in Sumner County for 10 VHF P25 portable radios with throat mikes and chargers for the city HazMat team. The City of Gallatin investment is \$21,260.
