

Resolution No. RS2019-29

A resolution approving an application for a Homeland Security Grant from the State of Tennessee, Tennessee Emergency Management Agency, to The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Office of Emergency Management.

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee, Tennessee Emergency Management Agency, is accepting applications for a fiscal year 2019 Homeland Security Grant with an award of \$230,654.00 with no cash match required to fund costs related to enhancing preventative capabilities for chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and improvised explosive device (IED) detection and response; and,

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Government is eligible to participate in this grant program; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this grant application be approved and submitted.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the Metropolitan Government's application for the fiscal year 2019 Homeland Security Grant with an award of \$230,654.00, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved, and the Office of Emergency Management is authorized to submit said application to the State of Tennessee, Tennessee Emergency Management Agency.

Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.




Program Description:



Project Title: A: Fusion Center Maturation and Expansion

Investment Justification: Improving Information Sharing and Intelligence Fusion

National Priority: Maturation and enhancement of state fusion center.

STATE HOMELAND SECURITY STRATEGY

Objectives: Create a collaborative information sharing environment, using the Tennessee State Fusion Center.

DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The State of Tennessee Fusion Center, which shares intelligence information with all public safety disciplines, is working on several technology-based projects to expand their capabilities. The HSD5 Task Force deliberated with a representative of the State OHS at its meeting and it was decided not to provide funding support out of its FY19 allocated monies, as it creates potential informational value to the district. Investment Justification: Sustain CBRNE Detection & Response Capabilities

National Priority: Building and sustaining law enforcement terrorism prevention capabilities.

Goal from State Strategy: Enhance Tennessee's preventative capabilities for chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and improvised explosive device (IED) detection and response.

Objectives: Sustain Mass Care Services.

DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

All counties of the District 5 EMS Committee for Homeland Security have started preparing for active shooter responses and events. In doing so, the committee agreed to purchase ballistic vests, helmets, and active shooter treatment kits for their services. In 2019, the committee will use the grant monies to finish up needed equipment (vests/helmets) and supplies (med kits) for this project. With the completion of this purchase, each county in district 5 will be prepared to respond to and take care of active shooter events.

Funds were also allocated for swift water equipment, attending the HS Conference, headsets and PTT connections, gas monitors and a gas calibration kit.

Objectives: Sustain Mass Search and Rescue Operations.

DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Funds received from FY19 Homeland Security Grant Program will continue to support all of District 5 via one centralized training schedule. With these funds, personnel will be sent to training that assists in the sustainment of the current capabilities of TN Task Force 2 Urban Search and Rescue team. Returning personnel will in turn conduct training throughout District 5 to agencies supporting a regional response.

Overview of Training

Training is designed to provide students with the knowledge, skills and abilities to perform rescue at structural collapse scenes due to natural disaster or terrorist incidents. Personnel will receive the necessary knowledge, skills and abilities to perform exterior shoring and interior shoring operations, breaching, breaking, cutting, and burning operations, and lifting and moving techniques at structural collapse incidents. The scope of the course addresses priorities and capabilities that Department of Homeland Security is encouraging state and local jurisdictions to establish.

\$25,000 was also allocated to be used towards Position Specific AHIMT courses that will be conducted for District 5 personnel.

Project Title: B: Enhance & Sustain USAR, HAZMAT Special Ops Capabilities

Investment Justification: Sustain CBRNE Detection & Response Capabilities

National Priority: Building and sustaining law enforcement terrorism prevention capabilities.

STATE HOMELAND SECURITY STRATEGY

Goal from State Strategy: Enhance Tennessee's preventative capabilities for chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and improvised explosive device (IED) detection and response.

Objectives: Sustain Sreening, Search and Detection.

DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This investment will expand capabilities, sustainment of and enhance the response and application of resources for Tennessee Homeland Security District 5. While Tennessee Task Force 2 (TNTF2) Urban Search and Rescue Team, established in 1995, is based in Davidson County, it is also a statewide response asset. This project will help build their capability with increased training for the TNTF2 canine team. The Nashville Fire Department Hazmat Team (Type I) will benefit by expanding capabilities, sustainment and enhancement of response and application of resources for hazmat and WMD threat related incidents by increasing its capability of air sampling and detection devices. TNTF2, as well as other specialized teams throughout the district, have worked diligently over the past 8 years to prepare specialized capabilities to respond to emergency incidents of all scopes and magnitude. These teams have attended training and exercises, both locally and nationally, to gain knowledge, skill and ability to work in numerous types of environments. The response equipment will continue to provide a safe and efficient response for citizens and responders locally and across the region. This, in turn, would expedite the mitigation and recovery process for the whole community.

Williamson County will be purchasing water operations equipment. Brentwood Fire Department is purchasing an air cart cover, technical rescue air cart, and high pressure hose. Smyrna Fire Department will be purchasing a portable decon roller system,

Objectives: Sustain Sreening, Search and Detection.

DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Funds received from FY19 Homeland Security Grant Program will expand the sustainment, enhancement and standardization of the HAZMAT, Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD), Improvised Explosive Devices (IED), Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive (CBRNE) capabilities and personal protection for responders who support Homeland Security District 5 initiatives. This supports the National, State and Nashville Homeland Security District 5 strategy to strengthen CBRNE detection, response and decontamination capabilities and also strengthen IED response and detection operations. The District 5 response objective is to sustain, enhance and expand capabilities while preparing to respond to a district, state or national event. This investment will allow Law Enforcement disciplines across the district broaden their scope of deter, detect, respond, mitigate and recover from incidents which may involve Hazmat/IED/CBRNE elements and to reduce the overall loss of lives.

Davidson County will be receiving a Tactical Communication device for hostage negotiations along with a boat motor for swift water deployments. Trousdale County will be receiving four ballistic shields for tactical operations. Rutherford County will be purchasing air purifying respirators, night vision equipment and a tactical robot. Wilson County is requesting that wireless upgrades be made to their Remotec Andros Robot, tactical communication equipment, and night vision equipment with scope.

DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Homeland Security District 5 (HSD5) sub-committee of Communications is proposing the expenditure of HSD5 funds for 15 UHF P25 trunking radios for interoperability on the new Sumner County trunked radio system . The Sumner County investment is 25,500. The expenditure of funds also for Cannon County in interoperability communications with a microwave shot between two towers, a pneumatic tower mast for the communications trailer and 2 All Band Portable radios for interoperability within HSD 5. The Cannon County investment is \$37,189. The expenditure of funds to Wilson County is for 15 VHF P25 portable radios for interoperability communications. The Wilson County investment is \$14,250. The expenditure of funds to Rutherford County is for the printing of TN Communications CommFogs for all HSD5 agencies. The Rutherford County investment is \$1,210.
