

Resolution No. RS2019-8

A resolution accepting a grant from the Friends of Metro Animal Care & Control to The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, to help support the Safety Net Program, Spay/Neuter Program, and Emergency Medical Fund.

WHEREAS, the Friends of Metro Animal Care & Control have awarded a grant in an amount not to exceed \$30,500.00 with no cash match required to The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, to help support the Safety Net Program, Spay/Neuter Program, and Emergency Medical Fund; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this grant be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the grant by and between the Friends of Metro Animal Care & Control, in an amount not to exceed \$30,500.00, and The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Metropolitan Board of Health, to help support the Safety Net Program, Spay/Neuter Program, and Emergency Medical Fund, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the amount of this grant is to be appropriated to the Metropolitan Department of Health based on the revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.







DONATION ALLOCATION REQUEST

July 2019

Overview:

Friends of MACC raises money to support the life-saving programs offered at Metro Animal Care and Control (MACC). We regularly meet with Lauren Bluestone, MACC director, to ensure our efforts align with current shelter needs. Based on those conversations and the money we have raised during the first half of our fiscal year, we would like to allocate presently available funds toward three of MACC's programs that help families stay together, lower pet overpopulation, and save more lives.

Via the terms set forth in our Memorandum of Understanding and the 2019 Fundraising Initiatives, which the board previously approved, we request permission to provide the following funds to MACC.

Available Funds:

Through donations we have received through such avenues as online donations, Facebook fundraisers, Board of Health-approved events outlined in our submitted budget, and in-kind donations from various community members, we have available funds for the following programs:

- **Safety Net Program | \$20,000 | FoM Expenditure Category: Community Engagement***
We would like to allocate \$20,000 toward MACC's Safety Net Program, which supports families experiencing hardship with maintaining ownership of their pets. This is a vital program for intake diversion and helping build stronger relationships with Davidson County residents.
- **Spay/Neuter Program | \$10,000 | FoM Expenditure Category: Community Engagement***
We would like to allocate \$10,000 toward MACC's Spay/Neuter Program, which helps with ensuring pets in MACC's care receive spay/neuter surgeries. What's more, this program helps to ensure we are working to decrease overpopulation.
- **Emergency Medical Funds | \$500 | FoM Expenditure Category: Enrichment**
We would like to allocation \$500 toward MACC's Emergency Medical Fun, which we have specified as a line item within our Enrichment budget category. Through this fund, MACC can help deliver life-saving services to animals that need higher levels of care or access to medical services (i.e. X-rays) that aren't immediately available within the shelter. MACC's emergency medical fund allows the medical team to save more lives, lowering the euthanasia rate, by giving them the ability to expand the services we provide to animals in need.

Board Approval:

We humbly request that the Board of Health approve these three contributions for MACC so the staff can continue to help the residents and homeless animals in our community. Once approved, Friends of MACC will present the monies, which are already available, via check to MACC so that it can be forwarded to the budget department at the Metro Public Health Department.
