

Resolution No. RS2019-55

A resolution accepting a grant from the Davidson County Mental Health and Veteran's Court Assistance Foundation to The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Davidson County General Sessions Court, Division II, to supplement employee salaries and assist in providing direct assistance to Veteran's Treatment Court participants.

WHEREAS, the Davidson County Mental Health and Veteran's Court Assistance Foundation has awarded a grant in an amount not to exceed \$85,445.00 with no cash match required to The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Davidson County General Sessions Court, Division II, to supplement employee salaries and assist in providing direct assistance to Veteran's Treatment Court participants; and,

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the citizens of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County that this grant be accepted.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1: That the grant by and between the Davidson County Mental Health and Veteran's Court Assistance Foundation, in an amount not to exceed \$85,445.00, and The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Davidson County General Sessions Court, Division II, to supplement employee salaries and assist in providing direct assistance to Veteran's Treatment Court participants, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, is hereby approved.

Section 2: That the amount of this grant is to be appropriated to the Davidson County General Sessions Court, Division II, based on the revenues estimated to be received and any match to be applied.

Section 3: That this resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.

This correspondence is to inform you that the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services has renewed an operation support grant for the Veteran's Treatment Court in Davidson County, Nashville, Tennessee through the Davidson County Mental Health and Veterans Court Assistance Foundation. The purpose of the grant is the continued operation of a collaborative effort with the Metropolitan Davidson County General Sessions Court to address the particular needs of justice-involved U.S. Military Veterans.

Over the duration of this grant from the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, the Foundation will award the Davidson County General Sessions Court, Division II, the amount of \$85,445.00 throughout this next fiscal year, concluding on June 30, 2020. These appropriated dollars will be allocated to the Metropolitan Davidson County Government General Sessions Court on a monthly basis. These dollars will supplement existing Metropolitan Government General Sessions Court employee salaries that work directly with the Davidson County Veteran's Treatment Court, as well as assist in providing direct assistance to participants of the Davidson County Veteran's Treatment Court under the direction of the Honorable Melissa Blackburn.

Please be aware this award is contingent to the allocation of funds from the State of Tennessee to the Davidson County Mental Health and Veteran's Assistance Foundation. 
