

ORDINANCE NO. _____

An ordinance to amend the Geographic Information Systems Street and Alley Centerline Layer for the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, by renaming a portion of Old Elm Hill Pike between McGavock Pike and Ermac Drive to “Sims Branch Way”. (Proposal Number 2020M-001SR-002).

WHEREAS, the request for the street name change has been submitted by Metro Public Works, applicant; and,

WHEREAS, there are two disconnected sections of roadway named Old Elm Hill Pike that could cause confusion for Emergency Services; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed request to change the name of this right-of-way has been submitted to and approved by the Metropolitan Planning Commission, and other relevant agencies of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, in accordance with Metropolitan Code § 13.08.015; and,

WHEREAS, the community deems it appropriate that said name be changed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE AND DAVIDSON COUNTY:

Section 1. That the Geographic Information Systems Street and Alley Centerline Layer for the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, as enacted by Ordinance No. BL2019-96, be and is hereby amended, as follows:

Renaming a section of Old Elm Hill Pike to “Sims Branch Way”, extending from McGavock Pike to the Ermac Drive, all of which is more particularly described by lines, words and figures on the sketch, which is attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance as though copied herein.

Section 2. The Director of the Department of Public Works is hereby authorized and directed, upon the enactment and approval of this ordinance, to cause said change to be made on said Map as set out in Section 1 of this ordinance, and to make notation thereon of reference to the date of passage and approval of this amendatory ordinance.

Section 3. Amendments to this legislation may be approved by resolution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its passage, the welfare of The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County requiring it.



In District 15 there are two disconnected sections of roadway named “Old Elm Hill Pike”. One roadway runs between Elm Hill Pk and Donelson Pk and the other runs between McGavock Pk and Ermac Dr. There are currently no addresses being used on the road between McGavock Pk and Ermac Dr.

Ordinance #2020-179, Proposal 2020M-001SR-001 renaming Old Elm Hill Pk to ‘Century Way’ has been deferred indefinitely. It was discovered that the use of the Century Way street name was not acceptable.

To solve the safety issue of two disconnected sections of roadway named Old Elm Hill Pk, Public Works would like to propose the name change of Old Elm Hill Pk between McGavock Pk and Ermac Dr to “**Sims Branch Way**” before there are any addresses assigned on this section. Changing the name of one of the duplicate roads named Old Elm Hill Pk will assist Emergency Services in the future to locate the correct street quickly. Council Member Syracuse agrees with this Street Renaming.

Enclosed is a portion of the Property Map designating the section of Old Elm Hill Pike proposed to be renamed “Sims Branch Way” through the Mandatory Referral process.
