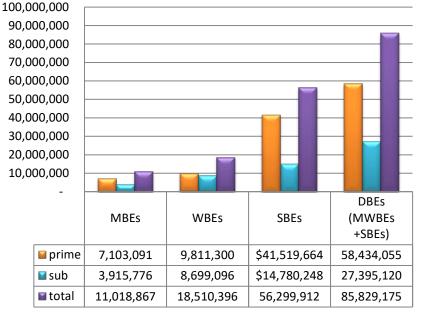

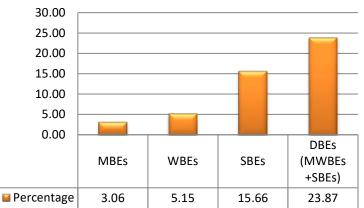

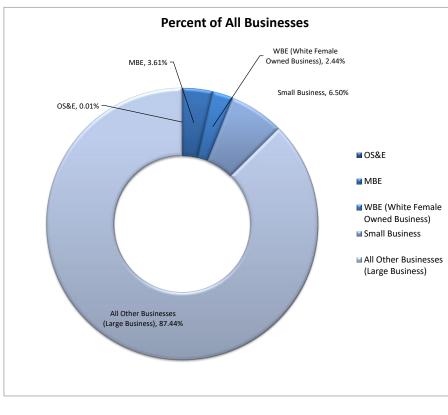

Comparative Analysis



Metropolitan Government of Nashville & Davidson County EBO and Outreach Update FY21 – 4th Quarter (April - June 2021)

Important points to note about the EBO Program which launched on July 5, 2019:

- 1. Metro Government awarded **18** contracts with race and gender conscious goals.
- 2. **16.0 million** is the total estimated spend with minority or woman owned businesses.
 - a. **6.3 million** is the total estimated spend with minority owned businesses.
 - b. **9.7 million** is the total estimated spend with woman owned businesses.
- 3. **21%** is the combined goal for minority or woman owned business participation.
 - a. **12%** is the average proposed goal for minority owned business participation.
 - b. **9%** is the average proposed goal for woman owned business participation.
- 4. **2** projects had an MBE prime, **1** project had a WBE prime, and **1** project had an SBE prime.
- There have been several department trainings to build familiarity and support for the EBO Program.
 To date, 82 Metro personnel have participated in training sessions to learn how MBE and WBE goals are established, and how they can help to ensure expediency in the procurement process.
