#### **Madison Station Blvd Project**

The truck apron surrounding the roundabout is complete. Work continues on the roadway base adjacent to Hardees, sidewalk adjacent to the retaining wall south of 50 Forward, and the remaining NES relocations. Topsoil is being added to the pond area. Light pole foundations, conduits and wires are being installed. Sidewalk adjacent to Bojangles as well as the driveway connection and curb on the west end of the Bojangles property are being completed.

#### **North Nashville - Capital Bikeways Project**

Work accomplished 9/4/21 – 9/10/21:

- PRI almost completed the GREEN MMA installation on 28<sup>th</sup> Ave N. They have one I-40 exit ramp crossing left.

Two-Week look ahead as weather allows:

- PRI to complete the GREEN MMA and install the WHITE symbols on the MMA on 28<sup>th</sup> Ave N at Albion St and at Jefferson St.
- We do not have a schedule for Special Operations to begin milling on Monroe St at this time.

### Projects Underway the Week of 9/12/2021 – 9/18/2021

KEY	
<b>Casting Adjustments</b>	Adjustment (lowering) of utilities to allow milling machines to traverse the roadway without damaging utility assets. Re-adjustment (raising) of utilities so that they will again be flush with the new surface that will be applied.
<b>Milling/Undercutting</b>	Removal (milling) of old surface using a milling machine. All milled surfaces must be cleaned by the milling contractor and marked appropriately to safely direct traffic. During undercutting the old surface that has failed is cut out and new material is put back in before it is resurfaced.
<b>Infrared</b>	A technique where infrared heating systems apply heat to pavement surfaces and aid in the removal of existing material and replacement with new asphalt mixture.
<b>Signal Loop Wires</b>	Signal Loop Wires are installed under the pavement. They are used to detect vehicles passing or arriving at a traffic light.
<b>Crack Seal</b>	A sealant put into the construction joint to keep water out so the road will not depreciate.
<b>Fog Seal</b>	A sealing put on the road to give the road an extended period before it gets paved.
