Every five years, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires the recipients of funds from the

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program,
- HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program,
- Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) Program, and
- Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) Program

to prepare a five-year Consolidated Plan that provides the framework for the process that will be used by the city to identify housing homeless, special populations, and community and economic development needs and resources and to tailor a strategic plan for meeting those needs.

This year, MDHA is partnering with the Homelessness Commission staff to conduct input sessions to hear from different stakeholders and the public about the needs and priorities for people experiencing homelessness.
