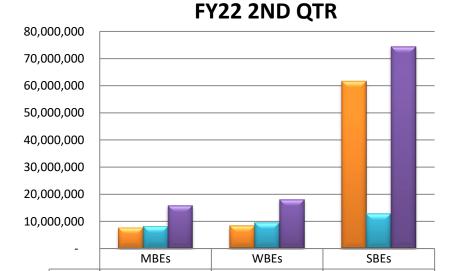

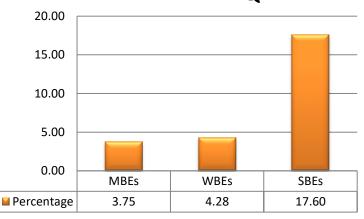

•	Metro Government awarded 20	contracts with race and gender conscious goals from	19
	solicitations during the quarter		

From these 20 contracts:

- **27.1 million** is the total proposed spend with minority or woman owned businesses.
 - **12.4 million** is the total proposed spend with minority owned businesses.
 - **14.7 million** is the total proposed spend with woman owned businesses.
- 18% is the combined proposed goal for minority or woman owned business participation.
 - 8% is the average proposed goal for minority owned business participation.
 - **10%** is the average proposed goal for woman owned business participation.
- 19 unique MBE subcontractors were proposed for utilization, and 23 unique WBE subcontractors were proposed for utilization.
- 4 Certified Minority Business Enterprises (MBEs) bid as a prime contractor, 2 Certified WBE Business Enterprises (WBEs) bid as a prime contractor, and 13 Metro Approved Small Business Enterprises (SBEs) bid as a prime contractor.
- 1 contract was awarded to an MBE prime, and 2 contracts were awarded to an SBE prime.
