Anticipated timeline is marginally lengthy relative to other offers and is below expectations in this regard.

Organizational chart shows a team that is small relative to other offers, raising concern about ability to perform scope details in limited period, and is slightly below expectations in this regard.

Project approach references non-disclosure agreements that may not be compatible with either applicable statute or the spirt of this study and is below expectations in this regard.

Weaknesses

Project narrative is overly focused on inventory of independent music venues, under focused on developing detailed profiles for select independent music venues and is below expectations in this regard.

Project narrative is overly reliant on web surveys as instrument for collecting qualitative/quantitative data and is below expectations in this regard.
