

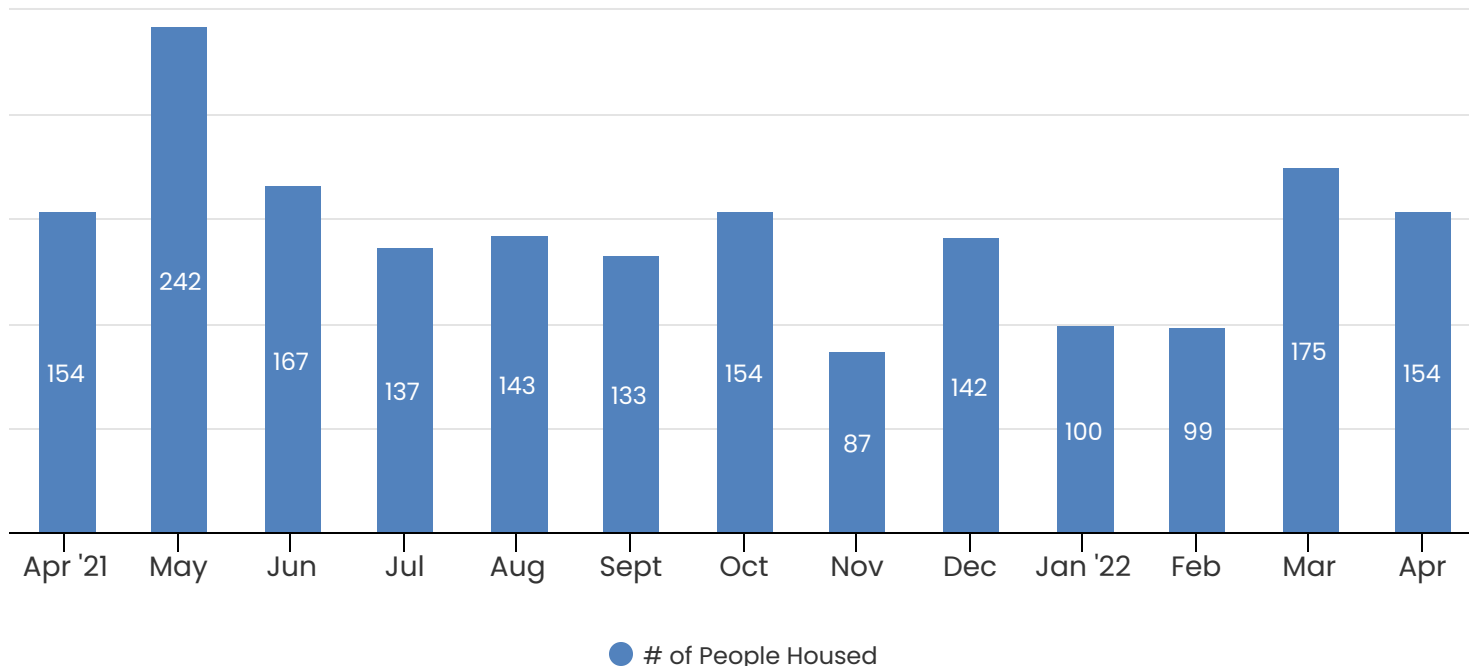
# 1,887 people experiencing homelessness were housed in Nashville from April 2021 through April 2022.

Source: De-duplicated Nashville-Davidson County HMIS data for clients who moved from **homelessness to housing**, including:

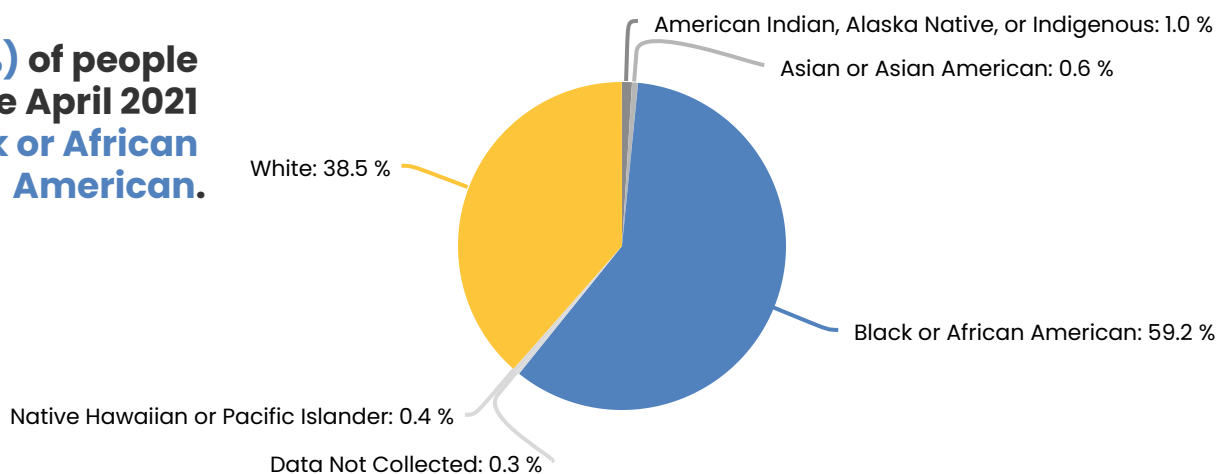
- Exits to permanent housing destinations from **Emergency Shelters\***, **Transitional Housing**, **Street Outreach**, and **Support Services** programs;
- **Rapid Rehousing** and **Permanent Housing** housing move-ins dates; and
- Other exits to permanent housing documented in **Coordinated Entry (CE)** and **Domestic Violence Coordinated Entry (DV CE)\*\***.

\*This data does not include information from the Nashville Rescue Mission.

\*\*DV CE data only includes the heads of household's information, and may under-represent the number of people fleeing domestic violence who were housed.



**Over half (59%) of people housed since April 2021 were Black or African American.**



# Street Outreach

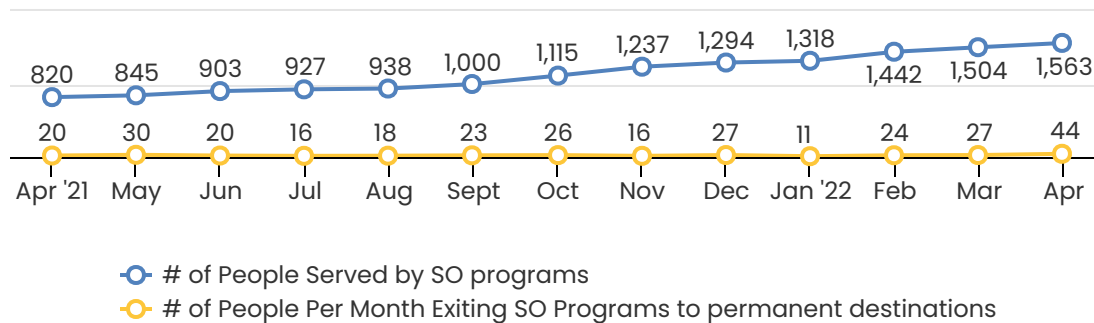


**Street Outreach (SO)** projects offer services necessary to reach out to people experiencing unsheltered homelessness, connects them to emergency shelters, housing, or other services, and provides urgent non-facility-based care to people unwilling or unable to access emergency shelter or other housing.

- 15 agencies provided Street Outreach services to **1,563 clients (1,468 households)** in April.
- **44 clients** exited Street Outreach programs to **permanent housing destinations** in April.
- 2,294 unique clients have been served by Street Outreach projects since April 2021.
- The completeness of this data has fluctuated based on agency participation.



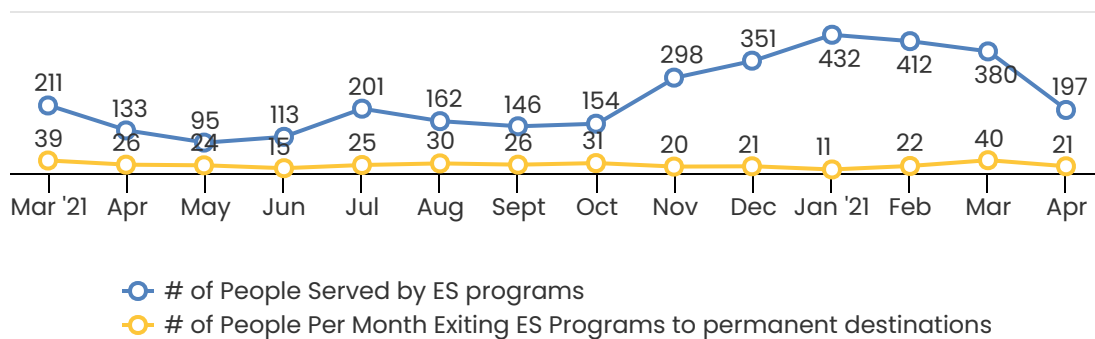
# Emergency Shelters

**Emergency Shelter (ES)** projects offer temporary shelter/lodging for people experiencing homelessness in general or specific populations of people experiencing homelessness.

- 8 agencies provided Emergency Shelter bed services to 197 clients (123 households) in April . This increase is in part due to Nashville's cold weather shelters.
- **21 clients** exited Emergency Shelter programs to **positive housing destinations** in April.
- 878 unique clients have been served by Emergency Shelter projects since April 2021.

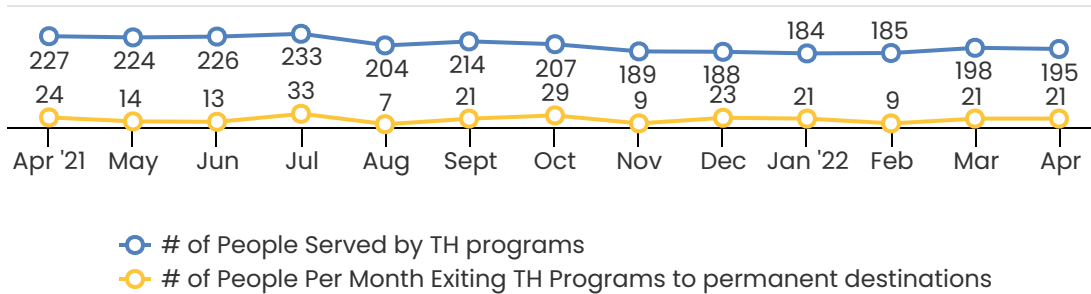
# Transitional Housing

**Transitional Housing (TH)** projects provide individuals and families experiencing homelessness with the interim stability and support needed to successfully move to and maintain permanent housing.

- 6 agencies provided Transitional Housing services to 195 clients (166 households) in March. This data does not include the Nashville Rescue Mission.
- 21 clients** exited Transitional Housing programs to **positive housing destinations** in April..
- 510 unique clients have been served by Transitional Housing programs since April 1 2021.



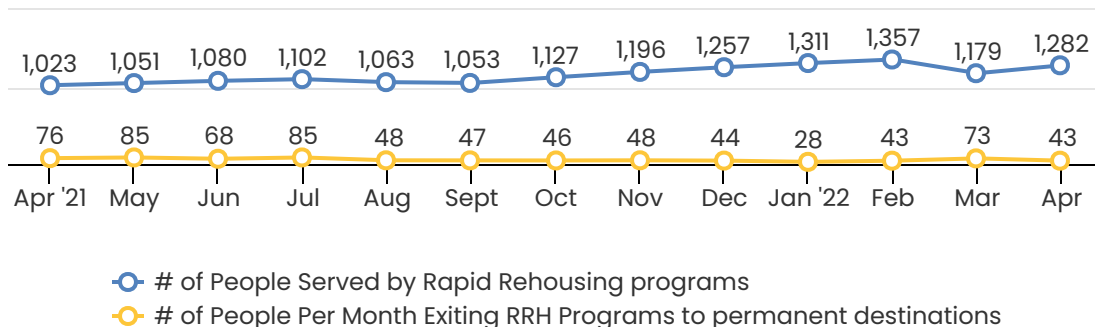
# Rapid Rehousing

**Rapid Rehousing (RRH)** projects fund short- or medium-term rental assistance and housing relocation/stabilization services designed to quickly move individuals and families from emergency shelters or places not meant for habitation into permanent housing.

- 11 agencies provided Rapid Rehousing services to 1,282 clients (728 households) in April.
- 760** of those people (449 households) have **moved into housing** so far.
- 43 clients** exited Rapid Rehousing programs to **positive housing destinations** in April .
- 2,192 unique clients have been served by Rapid Rehousing programs since April 2021.



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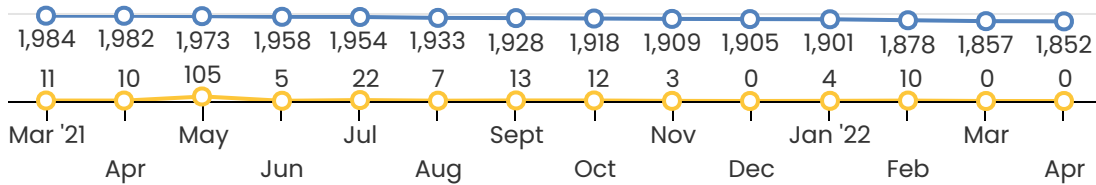
# Permanent Housing

**Permanent Housing (PH)** projects are community-based housing without a designated length of stay in which formerly homeless individuals and families live as independently as possible. Under PH, a program participant must be the tenant on a lease for an initial term that is renewable. Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) projects are projects that offer permanent housing and supportive services to assist homeless persons with a disability to live independently.

- 6 agencies provided Permanent Housing services to **1,852** clients (1,275 households) in March.
- \*The month of May 2021 included a large-scale data clean-up effort for projects that no longer updated client information in HMIS.
- 0 clients exited Permanent Housing programs to positive housing destinations in March.
- 2,092 unique clients have been served by PH programs since March 1 2021.

 ○ # of People Per Month Exiting PH programs to permanent destinations

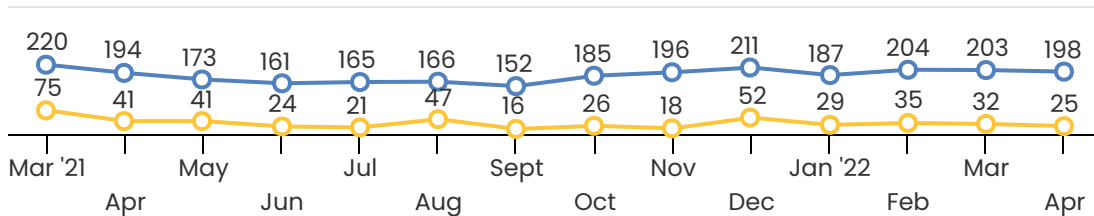
# Homelessness Prevention

**Homelessness Prevention (HP)** projects fund short-and/or medium-term rental assistance and housing relocation and stabilization services (financial assistance and service costs) designed to prevent an at-risk individual or family from moving into an emergency shelter or place not meant for habitation.
