


# 2,078 people experiencing homelessness were housed in Nashville from September 2021 through August 2022.


- Exits to permanent housing destinations from Emergency Shelters\*, Transitional Housing,




### **Housing Exits by Destination**

### **Street Outreach**



**Street Outreach (SO)** projects offer services necessary to reach out to people experiencing unsheltered homelessness, connects them to emergency shelters, housing, or other services, and provides urgent non-facility-based care to people unwilling or unable to access emergency shelter or other housing.



- 15 agencies provided Street Outreach services to 1,720 clients (1,648 households) in August.
- 22 clients exited Street Outreach programs to permanent housing destinations in August.
- 2,378 unique clients have been served by Street Outreach projects since September 2021.
- The completeness of this data has fluctuated based on agency participation.

### **Emergency Shelters**


**Emergency Shelter (ES)** projects offer temporary shelter/lodging for people experiencing homelessness in general or specific populations of people experiencing homelessness.

- 8 agencies provided Emergency Shelter bed services to 257 clients (190 households) in August.
- 28 clients exited Emergency Shelter programs to positive housing destinations in August.
- 1,171 unique clients have been served by Emergency Shelter projects since September 2021.



- 28 clients exited Transitional Housing programs to positive housing destinations in August.
- 477 unique clients have been served by Transitional Housing programs since September 2021.

# **Rapid Rehousing**


**Rapid Rehousing (RRH)** projects fund short-or medium-term rental assistance and housing relocation/stabilization services designed to quickly move individuals and families from emergency shelters or places not meant for habitation into permanent housing.

- 11 agencies provided Rapid Rehousing services to 1,465 clients (726 households) in August.
- 951 of those people (451 households) have moved into housing so far.
- 74 clients exited Rapid Rehousing programs to positive housing destinations in August.
- 2,256 unique clients have been served by Rapid Rehousing programs since September 2021.

# Permanent Housing




Permanent Housing (PH) projects are community-based housing without a designated length of stay in which formerly homeless individuals and families live as independently as possible. Under PH, a program participant must be the tenant on a lease for an initial term that is renewable. Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) projects are projects that offer permanent housing and supportive services to assist homeless persons with a disability to live independently.

- 0 clients exited Permanent Housing programs to positive housing destinations in August.

- # of People Per Month Exiting PH programs to permanent destinations


### **Homelessness Prevention**

Homelessness Prevention (HP) projects fund short-and/or medium-term rental assistance and housing relocation and stabilization services (financial assistance and service costs) designed to prevent an at-risk individual or family from moving into an emergency shelter or place not meant for habitation.

- 10 agencies provided Homelessness Prevention services to 222 clients (87 households) in August.
- 34 clients exited Homelessness Prevention programs to positive housing destinations in August.
- 647 unique clients have been served by HP programs since September 2021.
