


1,905 people experiencing homelessness were housed in Nashville from November 2021 through October 2022.



Street Outreach



Street Outreach (SO) projects offer services necessary to reach out to people experiencing unsheltered homelessness, connects them to emergency shelters, housing, or other services, and provides urgent non-facilitybased care to people unwilling or unable to access emergency shelter or other housing.



- 16 agencies provided Street Outreach services to 1,868 clients (1,794 households) in October.
- 14 clients exited Street Outreach programs to permanent housing destinations in October.
- 2,528 unique clients have been served by Street Outreach projects since November 2021.
- The completeness of this data has fluctuated based on agency participation.

Emergency Shelter (ES) projects offer temporary shelter/lodging for people experiencing homelessness in general or specific populations of people experiencing homelessness.



- 3 clients exited Emergency Shelter programs to positive housing destinations in October.

Transitional Housing




Transitional Housing (TH) projects provide individuals and families experiencing homelessness with the interim stability and support needed to successfully move to and maintain permanent housing.

- 7 agencies provided Transitional Housing services to 201 clients (167 households) in October. This data does not include the Nashville Rescue Mission.
- 13 clients exited Transitional Housing programs to positive housing destinations in October.
- 443 unique clients have been served by Transitional Housing programs since November 2021.

Rapid Rehousing

Rapid Rehousing (RRH) projects fund short-or medium-term rental assistance and housing relocation/stabilization services designed to quickly move individuals and families from emergency shelters or places not meant for habitation into permanent housing.



- 11 agencies provided Rapid Rehousing services to 1,484 clients (714 households) in October.
- 836 of those people (411 households) have moved into housing so far.
- 37 clients exited Rapid Rehousing programs to positive housing destinations in October.
- 2,349 unique clients have been served by Rapid Rehousing programs since November 2021.

Permanent Housing




Permanent Housing (PH) projects are community-based housing without a designated length of stay in which formerly homeless individuals and families live as independently as possible. Under PH, a program participant must be the tenant on a lease for an initial term that is renewable. Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) projects are projects that offer permanent housing and supportive services to assist homeless persons with a disability to live independently.

Homelessness Prevention (HP) projects fund short-and/or medium-term rental assistance and housing relocation and stabilization services (financial assistance and service costs) designed to prevent an at-risk individual or family from moving into an emergency shelter or place not meant for habitation.


