# SAVING AND STRENGTHENING TREE CANOPY AND GREEN SPACE

- Joining Trust for Public Land's 10-Minute Walk Campaign

- Record investments in Metro Parks

- Every other week residential curbside recycling
- Piloting residential compost collection

- Potential requirements to recycle construction and demolition waste from large commercial projects
- Potential adoption of Metro government and community-wide target for food waste reduction
