- Metro Finance approved the release of the RFA for the 2nd round of funding in the amount of \$13,600,678.37.
- MDHA released the RFA on May 17, 2023.
- Applications will be accepted until September 29, 2023, or funds are exhausted.

Be A Helping Hand – A Success Story

- The first two units of the Permanent Supportive Housing funded in part by the Gap Financing are ready.
- Two referrals have been made and the families are working with case managers to complete the necessary documents to move in.
 - Both families are currently sheltered by and working with Safe Haven Family Shelter.
 - Both families have been approved for a four-bedroom voucher.
 - One family is a two-parent household with eight children while the other is a single mother with six children.

Low Barrier Housing Collective (LBHC):

- 149 properties are participating in the collective.
- Landlords received incentives for housing 95 households experiencing homelessness.
- Positions are currently open and posted for Landlord Engagement Manager and Housing Navigator positions.

Competitive Grants:

• RFP will go out by the end of July.
