## **Short Description:**

Updates to Monroe Park: Replace aging playground equipment, add pedestrian signage, add picnic tables and plant new trees.

## **Long Description:**

Monroe Park is a North Nashville community park in a residential neighborhood near the North Library Branch. This is one of the few green spaces between 65 and Rosa L Parks. The project would upgrade the park by adding a water fountain, picnic tables, and an upgraded play area with a safer service. Additionally, the project would replace trees lost in weather events to make for a more shaded urban oasis. Install safety signage between the entry points of the basketball court and playground on the alley that separates the park.

## **Metro Comments**

- A new water fountain with bottle filler, two bowls for people, and a dog bowl is being installed any day by Metro, not funded by PB.
- Install a 2-12 playground. \$425,000
- Install picnic tables. \$15,000.
- Add signage to the alley \$500.
- Allowance to replace trees. \$25,000

This project page has been curated by a budget delegate, drawing inspiration from ideas submitted by Nashville residents until June 20, 2023. It has been shaped with initial input regarding scope and budget from a Metro department. While Metro is committed to adhering to the specified scope, adjustments or even the potential elimination of certain aspects may become necessary during implementation, influenced by site-specific or unforeseen conditions. Furthermore, the projects' funding source is from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), which current guidelines require all ARPA-funded projects be completed by December 2026. Should any project be delayed or expected to be delayed beyond this deadline, it shall be subject to elimination. The implementation timeline will be rigorously monitored to ensure compliance with this crucial requirement. Any prospective alterations to the project will be subjected to rigorous scrutiny and resolution by the steering committee during their regularly scheduled meetings.
