Metropolitan Social Services is pleased to provide the 2023 edition of Know Your Community. This annual report provides Nashville and Davidson County with a comprehensive array of data, information, and maps on a wide range of social, economic, and demographic characteristics of the population. These data are presented at the Metro Council District level to allow for a granular look at key aspects of the social and economic wellbeing of the city's population. Major topics profiles are intended to demonstrate the interrelationship between many factors and poverty in Nashville. Examination of patterns in educational attainment and enrollment, workforce, housing, and transportation illustrates how these factors impact one another in significant ways. This report offers elected officials, the nonprofit community, and other local leadership with a resource that can inform public policy, program design and implementation, and strategic planning.

The Strategic Planning and Research staff of Metropolitan Social Services is pleased to produce this report and other analysis that provides the community with valuable and useful information. These capabilities in spatial data analysis through use of Geographic Information Systems are applied to these topics. Metropolitan Social Services was recently recognized by the U.S. Census Bureau for its work in using Census data in these ways to produce reporting on topics important to the economic and social wellbeing of the residents of Nashville.

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Definitions from the U.S. Bureau of the Census

Age according to the U.S. Census Bureau estimates appears in a variety of categories.

Civilian labor force is the total number of persons that are either employed or unemployed (actively seeking employment). Persons in the armed forces are excluded from this total.

Contract Rent is also known as "Rent Asked" and is the amount a housing unit currently costs to rent, without utilities or other housing expenses.

Cost Burdened Homeowner refers to a homeowner household where housing costs are over 30% of household income. For owner housing costs, the U.S. Census Bureau uses the sum of mortgage payments (if applicable), home equity loans, real estate taxes; insurance, utilities, and heating/cooling fuels. Severe Cost Burden means housing costs are 50% or more of household income.

Cost Burdened Renter refers to a renter household when monthly Gross Rent (which includes utilities) is over 30% of monthly household income. Severe Cost Burden means housing costs are 50% or more of household income.

Disability Status in the American Community Survey identifies five categories:

- Hearing difficulty: deaf or having serious difficulty hearing
- Vision difficulty: blind or having serious difficulty seeing, even when wearing glasses
- Cognitive difficulty: Because of a physical, mental, or emotional problem, having difficulty remembering, concentrating, or making decisions
- Ambulatory difficulty: Having serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs.
- Self-care difficulty: Having difficulty bathing or dressing
- Independent living difficulty: Because of a physical, mental, or emotional problem, having difficulty doing errands alone such as visiting a doctor's office or shopping

Educational Attainment refers to the highest degree or level of school completed. This is distinct from the level of school an individual is attending (shown in enrollment). This includes data for those without a high school education, with a high school education, Bachelor's degree, graduate or professional degree.

Employed refers to a person that did any work at all as paid employees during the week in which the survey is conducted; worked in their own business, profession, or on their own farm; or worked without pay at least 15 hours in a family business or farm. Also includes people who were temporarily absent from their jobs because of illness, bad weather, vacation, labor-management disputes, or personal reasons.

Ethnicity refers to persons in one of two categories, according to the U.S. Census Bureau: Hispanic or Latino or Not Hispanic or Latino. Ethnicity is not the same as Race. All persons are classified as belonging to One, or More than One, Race, totaling 100% of the population; all persons are classified as either Hispanic/Latino or Not Hispanic Latino, totaling 100% of the population.

Family is the term referring to two or more persons (one of whom is the householder) related by birth, marriage, or adoption residing in the same housing unit.

Family and Household Structure describe living arrangements that include family households, married households, male and female households, families and average size of families and households.

Family Income is classified by the U.S. Census Bureau in several categories. Data reflect the percentage of families making from incomes under \$15,000 a year to over \$150,000.

Family Income is the amount of income generated by the people who compose a family (living together and related by blood or marriage).

Foreign-born refers to any person who is not a U.S. citizen at birth. World Regions of Birth are classified by the U.S. Census Bureau as Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, Northern America and Oceania.

Full-Time, Year-Round Workers are all people 16 years old and over who usually worked 35 hours or more per week for 50 to 52 weeks in the past 12 months.

Gross rent includes rent plus estimated costs of utilities and heating/cooling fuels.

Group Quarters refers to those places where population does not live in housing units (house, apartment, mobile home, rented rooms). The two types of group quarters include institutional, such as correctional facilities, nursing homes, or mental hospitals; and non-Institutional, such as college dormitories, military barracks, group homes, missions, or shelters.

Households consist of all persons who occupy a housing unit regardless of relationship. A household may consist of a person living alone or multiple unrelated individuals or families living together.

Housing units refer to any place that persons normally live, including single-family houses, condominiums, apartments, mobile homes or trailers, a group of rooms, or a single room occupied as separate living quarters, or if vacant, intended for occupancy as separate living quarters. These do not include group quarters (see definition).

Languages Spoken is the term used by the U.S. Census Bureau referring whether households speak English only at home or speak a non-English language, and which language that is. Households that are reported as "Speak English less than very well" refer to households in which no one above the age of 14 speaks English very well and that may be considered to have Limited English Proficiency.

Margin of Error describes the range in which the actual value may be. For example, a value of 20 with a margin of error of 5 indicates that the actual value may lie between 15 to 25 years. The smaller the margin of error, the closer the reported value will be to the actual value. The U.S. Census Bureau determines specific margins of errors for each data set, but these are not included in this report.

Mean income is calculated by dividing the aggregate of all incomes reported by the population described by the total number of that population.

Median and Mean Income Source refers to various ways that income is obtained, including, among others, from Social Security, retirement, Supplemental Security Income, and cash from public assistance income.

Median Income refers to the level of income where ½ (one-half) of the defined population is below that level and ½ (one-half) above the median. This is used to classify household and family income levels.

Native born refers to any person born in the United States, Puerto Rico, or a U.S. Island Area, or anyone born abroad of at least one parent that was a U.S. citizen.

Nonfamily Income is that income generated by either an individual who lives alone or lives with others who are not related by blood or marriage.

Occupied housing units are the usual place where someone resides.

Owner Valuation of Housing refers to estimates based on owner reporting of how much a home would sell for if it were for sale. For vacant units, value is the price asked for the property.

Owner-occupied housing units are those that are owned by the person living there.

Per Capita Income is the mean income computed for every man, woman, and child in a particular group including those living in group quarters. It is derived by dividing the aggregate income of a particular group by the total population in that group.

Poverty is measured by the U. S. Census Bureau, based on a decades-old formula that considers only cash income and the number of persons in a household. Poverty Guidelines are updated each year and are used to determine household eligibility for federally funded programs. For the contiguous 48 states and District of Columbia, persons are considered in poverty when their income is below the following 2020 guidelines based on the number of persons in the household: 1 = \$12,760; 2 = \$17,240; 3 = \$21,720; 4 = \$26,200; 5 = \$30,680; 6 = \$35,160; 7 = \$39,640; 8 = \$44,120

A Supplemental Poverty Measure has been developed by the U.S. Census Bureau that considers additional types of income as well as necessary expenditures for health, employment, etc.

Race is classified by the U.S. Census Bureau in the following categories: White; Black or African American; American Indian and Alaska Native; Asian; and Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander. Population is also classified in the categories of Some Other Race and Two or More Races.

Renter-occupied housing units are those not owned by the person living there and who pays the owner for occupancy.

School Enrollment includes data about persons estimated as being enrolled in school (one that advances a person toward an elementary school certificate, a high school diploma, or a college, university or professional school (such as law or medicine) degree.

Unemployed refers to persons that had no employment during the week in which the survey is conducted and on which estimates are based; these persons were also available for work at that time and they made specific efforts to find employment sometime during the 4-week period ending with the reference week.

Vacant housing units are those where no one is living at time of conducting the estimate.

Worker Earnings represent the sum of wage or salary income and net income from self-employment. An individual with earnings is one who has either wage/salary income or self-employment income, or both. The American Community Survey provides data by categories including gender and full or part time work.

Workforce Status, also known as Labor Force Participation, is reported for population age 16 and over and includes the civilian labor force who are classified as Employed or Unemployed.

What is the American Community Survey?

The American Community Survey (ACS) is an ongoing survey conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau that provides vital information on a yearly basis about our nation and its people. Information from the survey generates data that help determine how more than \$675 billion in federal and state funds are distributed each year. The ACS helps local officials, community leaders, and businesses understand the changes taking place in their communities. It is the premier source for detailed population and housing information about our nation.

The American Community Survey uses a series of monthly samples to produce annually updated estimates for the same small areas (census tracts and block groups) formerly surveyed via the decennial census long-form sample. Initially, five years of samples were required to produce these small-area data. The Census Bureau released its first 5-year estimates in December 2010; new small-area statistics now are produced annually. The Census Bureau also produces 3-year and 1-year data products for larger geographic areas.

Data in each table are color-coded in each column. Davidson County data are shown first in each <u>row</u> (shaded in yellow). District data appear in the following <u>rows</u>. Data in each <u>column</u> appear in varying shades of a different color. Shades from lighter to darker in each column represent values that are lowest to highest among the 35 districts for that column (the lighter the shade of the color, the lower the value; the darker the shade of the color, the higher the value).

- Four Metro Council Districts have more than 50% African American population, Districts 1, 2, 3, and 21.

- Six Metro Council Districts have less than 3% Hispanic population, Districts 1, 4, 6, 21, 24, and 25.

Those districts with the lowest percentage of 'population that lived in the same house one year earlier' are the districts that have seen the comparatively largest amount of new population moving among all districts.
- The central Metro Council Districts have experienced some of the largest increases of new population, particularly the cluster of districts 17, 18, 19, 21, and 24. Two others with large increases, districts 27 and 32, are in the southeastern portion of Davidson County. These seven districts have experienced between one in three to one in four residents as newcomers to those districts.
- Overall, the western half of Davidson County has experienced comparatively lower levels of new population, though with some notable exceptions in districts 20 and 22.
- The majority of Metro Council Districts with comparatively lower levels of new population are on the border of Davidson County.

- The southeastern quadrant of Davidson County has the largest adult population without a high school diploma or equivalent. In three Metro Council Districts, 16, 28, and 30, this group is more than 20 percent of the adult population.
- Several Metro Council Districts in the northern half of Davidson County also have comparatively high levels on non-high school completion among adults, including districts 2 and 9 with non-completion rates of 15.8 and 19.6 percent, respectively.
- The southwestern quadrant of Davidson County has very low rates of high school noncompletion. The seven Districts with the lowest rates are in southwestern area and all have rates below 4 percent. Otherwise stated, over 96 percent of adults in those districts have a high school diploma or higher.
