In addition to 16,000 Park visitors in 2023, staff led school field trips and college labs, hosted day camps for community centers and served Nashville through scheduled public programs.


Friends of Beaman Park partnered with over 500 members of the community for special events, invasive plant removals and trail maintenance days.
