XIV. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

- Director Odom encouraged the Parks Board to visit park facilities or any of the special activities and events shared with them.
- Metro Council approved the Capital Spending Plan that included about \$32 million for the Parks Department. Many of the items included in our request are for deferred maintenance, and the funding included development of Mill Ridge and Mariposa Parks. Additionally, we will receive about \$5 million through the Mayor's Participatory Budgeting Program for playground improvements.
- The Celebrate Nashville Cultural Festival is a Nashville tradition going on 30+ years. The festival is always held the first Saturday in October at Centennial Park and attended by approximately 50,000 people. Up until this point a Sole Source contract has been used to procure the organizer for the event. We've been advised by Metro Procurement that the solicitation will need to be bid. We are moving forward based on guidance from Metro Procurement. We are looking forward to the Celebrate Nashville Cultural Festival in October.
- We have begun the preliminary phase of the solicitation process for the management agreement for Ascend Amphitheater. We're engaging with Procurement and look forward to moving into publishing a solicitation and getting the contract awarded by the start of next year.
- Congratulations to Darlene Morrow who is a superintendent in our Community Recreation division. Ms. Morrow will be inducted into the Tennessee State University Athletics Hall of Fame next month. Congratulations to Dr. Michelle Steele for her recent Athena Award nomination. The ceremony is at the end of this month.

Q & A

Ms. Scott-Barnes thanked Director Monique Odom on the communications related to the Emerald Ash Borer issue coming up in Percy Warner Park. Ms. Scott-Barnes suggested that it would be helpful for Director Odom to report that information to the listening public.

Director Odom commented that this was a multi-department collaboration, we have been in communication with all stakeholders about Emerald Ash Borer/hazardous tree removals. Communication updates/revisions will be made to the Metro EAB website.

We will develop a committee for replanting. We will certainly continue to work with the community throughout the county when we have removal of hazardous trees.

Ms. Scott-Barnes commented that she just wanted to ensure that we go above and beyond communicating because of the bill that was passed a couple years back regarding tree removal.

Director Odom commented that both Metro and Metro Parks conducted an extensive public awareness effort about Emerald Ash Borer explaining the marking on the trees. The public awareness effort included signage at that time and there will be revised signage posted in appropriate areas that will include a QR code to scan for information about the markings.
