NAMING COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS APPROVAL FOR THE REQUEST OF THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES COALITION TO RENAME CUMBERLAND PARK TO WASIOTO PARK.

Upon Motion of Mr. Henley, and seconded by Mr. DeLay, and discussion the Naming Committee recommended approval of the request of the Indigenous Peoples Coalition to rename Cumberland Park to "Wasioto Park".

Mr. Henley expressed that it should be noted as a part of the motion that the Park will be impacted by the activity happening on the East Bank. As the park is within the boundaries of the vision plan, its footprint will change and the areas near the Seigenthaler Pedestrian Bridge, as well as along the river bank will be modified for future infrastructure. Portions of the park will become inaccessible due to construction, and will have infrastructure placed where it does not currently exist. These revisions will be for access, recreational use, and storm water management.
