- O4-25-03 Staff requests approval of a Permit for Use of Park Space for the Southern Grasslands Institute (SGI) to restore habitat and grasslands and conduct various environmental studies at Ravenwood Park (Lytle Bend Park (Natural Area)). The permit is for a period of one year contingent upon all permit obligations being met. Copies of the permit will be available for review at the board meeting. Council District 14
- O4-25-04 Staff requests approval of a Permit for Use of Park Space for the Indigenous People's Coalition to plant and maintain a small "4 Sister" garden plots at West Park and Shelby Bottoms. The permit is for the period April to November, permit could be renewed as an annual permit if we decide to continue beyond November. Copies of the permit will be available for review at the board meeting. Council District 20 & 6
- O4-25-05 Staff requests approval of a Permit for Use of Park Space for the McCabe Little League for the Baseball and Tee Ball Fields at MacCabe Park (101 46th Avenue North, Nashville TN). The permit is for a period of one year contingent upon all permit obligations being met. Copies of the permit will be available for review at the board meeting. Council District 24
- **04-25-06** The Music City Disc Golf (MCDG) requests acceptance of an in-kind grant, valued at approximately \$3,350.00 for materials and installation for a nine-hole disc golf course at Brookmeade Park (7002 Charlotte Pike, Nashville, TN).

This course will provide a new recreational opportunity for park visitors, activating the space with consistent positive foot traffic and fostering community engagement. There is no required match or other obligation required by Metro Parks associated with this grant. All materials, installation costs, and ongoing repair and maintenance expenses will be covered directly by MCDG. MCDG will continue to work with Metro Park staff on the details of course design, materials, and scheduling of work. Music City Disc Golf will not proceed with the project until final approval is provided by appropriate parks staff. Council District 35

- O4-25-07 The Friends of Sevier Park requests acceptance of an in-kind grant, valued at approximately \$4,228.00, to purchase and install new soccer goals on the current soccer playing field at Sevier Park (3021 Lealand Lane, Nashville, TN 37204). No money will be donated to Metro Parks. The project will be paid for directly by the Friends of Sevier Park. Metro Parks Maintenance will remove the existing goals and install the new goals. The Friends of Sevier Park will continue to work with Metro Parks staff on the details of purchase and installation and will not proceed with the project until final written approval is provided by the appropriate Parks staff. - O4-25-08 The McCabe Park Little League's (MPLL) requests acceptance of an inkind grant, valued at approximately \$9,983.00, for improvements to the "small baseball field" at McCabe Park. There is no required match by Metro Parks associated with this grant. No money will be sent to Metro Parks. This project will be paid for directly by the MPLL. Council District 24
- O4-25-09 The Friends of Shelby Park and Bottoms requests acceptance of an inkind grant, valued at approximately \$30,000.00, for improvements of new wayfinding signs, 10 park information signs, 3 park map kiosks, and invasive plant management and native plant installation at Shelby Park and Bottoms. There is no required match by Metro Parks associated with this grant. No money will be sent to Metro Parks. This project will be paid for directly by the Friends of Shelby Park and Bottoms. Council District 6
- **04-25-10** The Watkins College of Art at Belmont University requests acceptance of an in-kind grant, not to exceed \$20,000.00, for a commissioned mural of art on the rear exterior wall of the Easley Community Center at E.S. Rose Complex (1000 Edgehill Ave, Nashville, TN). Watkins College of Art is a recipient of Metro Arts' THRIVE program award. This program connects artists and organizations with the community to create investments, cultural connections, and transformations.

- O4-25-11 The Friends of Green Hills Park requests acceptance of an in-kind grant, valued at approximately \$50,000.00, to install an exercise equipment station at Green Hills Park. Staff also, requests acceptance of an in-kind grant valued at approximately \$6,600.00 to extend a new water line in Green Hills Park to the northern-western corner and install an Acme thread Quick coupler installed in a 10-inch valve box in the ground. This will be used to water the native plants being installed. There is no required match by Metro Parks associated with this grant. No money will be sent to Metro Parks. This project will be paid for directly by the Friends of Green Hills Park. Friends of Green Hills Park will not proceed with the projects until final written approval is provided by the appropriate Metro Parks staff. Council District 25
