#### VII. OLD BUSINESS

#### 09-24-07

BOARD APPROVES MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN METRO PARKS AND CHEEKWOOD BOTANICAL GARDENS AND MUSEUM OF ART TO OUTLINE THE TERMS UNDER WHICH CHEEKWOOD WILL TRANSITION ITS OVERFLOW PARKING OPERATIONS OFF METRO PARKS PROPERTY.

Upon motion of Mr. DeLay, seconded by Mr. Henley, and discussion the Memorandum of Understanding between Metro Parks and Cheekwood Botanical Gardens and Museum of Art to outline the terms under which Cheekwood will transition its overflow parking operations off Metro Parks property while implementing transportation demand management strategies, was approved. The MOU shall be effective as of April 1, 2025, and shall continue for a term ending on December 31, 2027.

Ms. Scott-Barnes expressed concerns regarding details of the MOU and asked Metro Legal to advise regarding desired changes, if any, by the Board.

Ms. Macy Amos, Metro Legal commented that if desired, the Board may amend the agreement at any time in the future.

Ms. Scott-Barnes expressed concerns regarding the agreement being enforceable and executable for all parties due to unforeseen issues that arise.

Mr. Henley stated the agreement before the Board outlines a plan, objectives, and has a timeline with clear goals working toward termination of the MOU so that it is no longer needed. With these things in mind, he's inclined to support the agreement.

Ms. Mayes commented that it's important to note for the public that this vote is not related to the programming at Cheekwood and asked the chair to share specifically to what the vote is pertaining.

Ms. Macy Amos, Metro Legal commented that what's before the Board today is a transition plan to get Cheekwood patrons parking on Cheekwood property. There's a phased approach included in the MOU, in which certain milestones must be met by certain times. We are not voting on a proposed road; it's just a parking plan transitioning them off Park's property.

#### XIV. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

- Kick-off for the RESTORE Program (Reaching Economic Sustainability Through Opportunities Resources and Empowerment), at Napier Community Center was held February 22<sup>nd</sup>. This program is a Restorative Justice pilot program that was funded this fiscal year in partnership with the Mayor's Office for Youth Safety.
- The Metro Nashville Police Department Support Services Bureau held its recent staff meeting at the Parks Police Office and I was glad to be invited to participate with Captain Greg Davis. The Support Services Bureau is comprised of the following divisions: Parks Police Oversight, Traffic, Evidence and Storage, Special Operations, Customer Services, and Facilities Management and is led by Deputy Chief Tommy Widener. I am very grateful for our partnership with MNPD.
- We participated in the Southeast Community Center meeting on February 26<sup>th</sup>. This was an opportunity to engage with the constituents particularly those in the Antioch or Southeast area of Nashville and to answer questions about the Parks department.
