

# **Anthes Drive**

## **Housing Update and Progress Report**

The Office of Homeless Services (OHS), in partnership with community organizations, has successfully concluded housing efforts at the Anthes Drive site.

One resident, now in permanent housing, shared: “This is the first time I have ever felt like I was set up for success.” April Calvin says, “Thanks to the continued support of Metro leadership and our dedicated partners, this is what meaningful progress sounds like.”

### **HOUSING OUTCOMES (*as of June 3, 2025*)**

Total Housed: **107 Individuals** (This data is fluid and will be updated regularly).

- 81 moved into interim housing at Rodeway
- 10 placed with rental subsidies
- 5 in shared housing
- 3 in Community Care Fellowship housing
- 2 in transitional housing
- 2 with friends or family
- 1 with a VASH voucher subsidy
- 1 hospitalized
- 1 incarcerated (for unrelated issues)
- 1 outcome unknown

### **PET ACCOMMODATIONS**

48 pets were safely housed with their owners, ensuring families —human and animal — remained together:

- 35 pets moved to Rodeway
- 8 to shared housing (*including 7 pets with one resident through the Low Barrier Housing Collective*)

- 4 to rental subsidies
- 1 to CCF

### **VEHICLE & CAMPER SUPPORT**

- The site posed unique logistical challenges including unregistered vehicles, missing VINs, and lack of insurance.
- RV owners were offered towing and storage support.

### **ONGOING SUPPORTIVE SERVICES**

Housing is a critical first step, but long-term stability depends on continued access to supportive care. OHS teams, along with Hospitality Hub and other service providers, are delivering wraparound support including mental health services, employment assistance, and intensive case management.
