UPDATES	 The Nashville Department of Transportation (NDOT) presented on the Vision Zero effort to eliminate traffic fatalities, noting that many of those killed are people experiencing homelessness. NDOT requested feedback from the Continuum of Care regarding potential strategies for addressing increased vulnerability for those who are unhoused. The General Membership discussed a range of currently events utilizing the Menti platform. A key theme was discussing the need to proactively prepare for federal changes. The Nashville Rescue Mission agreed to present on their programming and capacity study at the October meeting.
