Old Business

• NHWLC Communication Plan update and next steps

Chair Robert Robinson asked Kim Molnar, Carleigh Frazier and Vice Chair Sarah Goodrich to provide the update.

- They shared that the 1-page communication document (attached) has been finalized. The comments from the members were taken into consideration and applied where able. Any additional comments will be incorporated into the next version of the 1-pager.
- The committee has drafted FAQs (attached) which will be available for the NHWLC members and the public to have clear instruction on how to engage with the NHWLC. The plan is to include this document on the webpage. Following a brief review of the FAQ document, no immediate additions or edits were recommended. The document will be shared with the members for edits and asked to return all edits to Tracy Buck by August 30.
- Next steps for the NHWLC
 - A call was made for additional member participation in the Communication committee.
 - Using the Communications Plan, the 1-pager, and the FAQs, Chair Robert Robinson, Vice Chair Sarah Goodrich, Jeff Wamble and Tracy Buck will begin scheduling meetings with Metro Council members to share about the NHWLC and increase support for the CHIP.

New Business

- **2026-2028 Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) “Sneak Peek”**

Chair Robert Robinson asked Jeff Wamble and Tracy Buck to share the first look at the work on the 2026-2028 CHIP. In July, the community met to address the 4 strategic issues identified in the CHA process. Using the template, Tracy Buck walked the members through the results of the community meetings. Two of the four groups required 2 sessions, and the other 2 groups worked in an asynchronous manner to complete the template. Each strategic issue now has a goal statement, objectives, partners and data indicators.

Questions from the members included:

- What's the plan for pairing down those data points?
- How will some of these larger, interconnected issues be addressed by the NHWLC?

The document will be shared with the work groups for final discussion and edits specifically regarding the partners and data. For most of the issues, the list of partners and data recommended will need to be prioritized to a more manageable number. The prioritized partner list will result in outreach efforts to confirm partner participation in the work. Several of the strategic issues overlap and efforts will need to be coordinated so that efforts are not addressed in a siloed fashion.

Jeff Wamble and Tracy Buck will start looking at the objectives and looking for alignment efforts so that the Davidson County CHIP will not exist in a vacuum. Members are asked to participate in the continuing conversations.

The “sneak peek” document is being withheld until the workgroups can refine objective language and prioritize partners and data indicators. An update will be provided at the September meeting.

- **Health Equity Coalition (HEC) transition update**

Chair Robert Robinson provided a high-level update on the transition of the HEC. With the decision to not have a stand-alone equity workgroup in the 2026-2028 CHIP, we will move to embed equity more fully into strategic issues. This requires the development of an alternate plan for the HEC. The recommendation is for the HEC to serve as a group that is more cross-cutting and provides additional support across the other workgroups. They will provide data, education, and resources to support the work of the council. Resources such as training or workshops on various topics and community engagement could be provided to the NHWLC, CHIP workgroups and community members. More information and a future presentation will be available before the end of the year.

Announcements and Adjourn

Chair Robert Robinson opened the floor for announcements or celebration points.

- **Metro Public Health Department**
 - Dr. Sanmi Areola shared that the health department has begun weekly email updates on program activities called Public Health Notes. The first issue was on school nurses and the second issue will be on the dental programs. Each issue will include information on how the public can access the highlighted programs. Members can let Tracy Buck know if you are interested in receiving Public Health Notes. You are asked to share email updates with your networks.

- Dr. Sanmi Areola shared that the department is focusing on developing a plan for Nashville to address community violence. We will be working with the Mayor's Office and expect an announcement in the coming weeks. There will be a taskforce convened to drive community engagement and ownership. Members of the NHWLC are invited to participate in this process. More information will be shared as it is available.
