There was potential that UTK could refund the position but unfortunately will be down that position for the foreseeable future. We lost 3 positions due to the funding.

**Metro Update**- Barbara and Andy discussed about the impact of SNAP currently. About 60,000 residents are affected in the community of Nashville. Hopeful that the impact is temporary. Andy shares that the education we do is based on the economy and currently on a wait and see. Also, if any programs need any adjustments. Melissa discussed about doing a lunch & learn series that can be virtual to spread news about the current situation and where to find resources at the moment. She has been trying to share info on social media about local food banks to help spread awareness. The mayor has a website called: "nashville.gov/food" Metro is looking to partner with 2<sup>nd</sup> Harvest and help out. Andy asks for any partners that need any educational services feel free to reach out. Andy discusses the board is up to 7 members.

**Budget Update**- Andy found out that our office has land across the street that is 0.382 acres. The land area will be cleared eventually. It will be a triangle lot. Andy and Amy have discussed all the opportunities that can happen with the land. Amy hopes to have a green-house, raised beds and an outdoor space for everyone to use with their program area. She is looking to get a committee for the new area once the goals are set and looking for a time-frame around January on how to move forward. The project will be done through metro but can be used through one of the universities.
