- 11-25-08** Legacy South LLC requests approval for a dedicated stormwater sewer easement and requests to construct associated stormwater infrastructure across a portion of Reservoir Park. The proposed work includes installation of new storm lines and the rerouting of an existing storm line. Council District 17.
- 12-25-04** Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Greenway Easement on property at 0 WHITES CREEK PIKE, WHITES CREEK, TN. 37189, Map and parcel 03000006800, along Earthman Fork Creek. This greenway easement will conserve 2.04 acres of open space and provide for future expansion of the Whites Creek Greenway network. The easement dedication was a condition of the Planning Commission's approval of the final plat for 0 Whites Creek Pike, 2025S-154-001. Council District 1.

- 12-25-05** Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Greenway Easement on property at 0 KEMP DR. HERMITAGE, TN. 37076, Map and Parcel 08700020300, along Dry Fork Creek. This greenway easement will conserve 2.39 acres of open space and provide for future expansion of the Stones River/Stoners Creek/Dry Fork Creek greenway network. The easement dedication was a condition of the Planning Commission's approval of the final plat for Overlook at Aaron's Cress, Phase 3, 2025S-096-001. Council District 12.
- 12-25-06** Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Greenway Easement on property at 0 MCCRORY LN. NASHVILLE, TN. 37221, Map and Parcel 12600015500, along the Harpeth River. This greenway easement will conserve 2.40 acres of open space and provide for future expansion of the Harpeth River Greenway. The easement dedication was a condition of the Planning Commission's approval of the final plat for Harpeth Overlook, 2024S-083-004. Design documents are available for review at the Parks Administrative Offices at 511 Oman Street. Council District 35.
- 12-25-07** Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Easement on property at 2518 W. HEIMAN ST. NASHVILLE, TN. 37208, Map and Parcel 081000003300. This greenway easement will conserve 0.61 acres of open space and provide for future expansion of the City Central Greenway network. The easement dedication was a condition of the Planning Commission's approval of the final plat for 2404-2518 West Heiman AKA The Lanes, 2022DP-062-002. Council District 21.
- 12-25-08** Staff requests approval of a Pedestrian Underpass Crossing Agreement with CSX to extend the Harpeth River Greenway from its current terminus at 1080 MORTON MILL RD. NASHVILLE, TN. 37221, Map and Parcel 141120E04500CO. This license provides for the expansion of the Harpeth River Greenway to Harpeth River Park and undeveloped park land. The connection from the Morton Mill terminus to the existing pedestrian bridge at Harpeth River Park was a condition of Council's approval of the Preliminary SP for Bend at Bellevue AKA Ariza, 2021SP-061-001. 01-26-02 The Friends of Two Rivers requests the acceptance of a Summit Commercial Ice Maker valued at \$1,500 to be installed at Stone Hall (Model No. BIM44G and Serial No. 2201140068.) This donation will help facilitate efforts to activate Stone Hall for event rentals. The Friends of Two Rivers will be responsible for installation and maintenance of the ice maker. Council District 15.

01-26-03 The Hillsboro-West End Neighborhood Association (HWEN) requests acceptance of a cash grant of up to approximately \$5,500 to fund the annual maintenance and repair costs of the mosaic “Sea Serpent” sculpture (commonly referred to as “the dragon”) at Fannie Mae Dees Park in 2026. The work will be completed by Art Up under an existing maintenance agreement. This grant requires no financial obligation from Metro Parks. Council District 18.
