
What is Choose How You Move (CHYM)?

CHYM is Nashville’s voter-approved transportation improvement program, funded by a dedicated ½ cent surcharge. It provides a dedicated, long-term, reliable source of funding to expand access to transit via new and improved sidewalks, more reliable transit through upgraded traffic signals, 24/7 transit service, and critical transit safety improvements across Nashville and Davidson County. CHYM is designed to accelerate priority projects, support daily mobility, and make it easier for all Nashvillians to move safely and efficiently—whether connecting to transit by foot, car, bus, or bike.

What Are We Funding Now?

This initial \$104 million drawdown marks a major milestone, shifting us from planning to building and turning votes into visible progress. Between Fall 2025 and early 2026, the CHYM program will:

- Drive steady progress across all four voter-approved priorities
- Use funds responsibly through careful planning, expert oversight, and phased implementation
- Deliver on the promise Nashvillians voted for.




Benefits for Everyone

- **86 miles of new sidewalks**
- **Faster travel times on WeGo with new crosstown and connector routes**
- **Traffic signals upgraded to smart signals at 592 intersections**
- **24/7 WeGo service hours**
- **Citywide safety improvements for drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists**

CHYM Project Prioritization

With the program's own dedicated funding source in place, CHYM dollars are ready to invest now. These dollars accelerate key transportation projects and make new investments possible that might not fit within traditional funding limits.

CHYM uses a wide array of factors in prioritizing project implementation, including:



Areas with the greatest transportation needs or barriers



Readiness for construction



Safety concerns or crash data



Connections to major destinations (airport, hospital, and job centers)

These early investments lay the groundwork for the full suite of projects that are ready to be accelerated for faster, safer, more connected travel throughout Nashville — just as voters envisioned.
