Old Business

- **Update to Member Reappointments for 2026**

- **2026-2028 CHIP Dashboard Update**

Vice Chair Sarah Goodrich extended an invitation to Carleigh Frazier to present an update regarding the forthcoming process as the NHWLC determines the procedure and functionality of the 2026-2028 CHIP dashboard.

During the December meeting, members expressed a desire to participate in a Give-Get Grid discussion to better understand their expectations and contributions to the dashboard initiative.

Carleigh Frazier provided an overview of the Give-Get Grid process and outlined how the conversation will unfold in February. Members will be encouraged to review the information available in the NHWLC member SharePoint space to begin formulating content for the Give-Get Grid. This document will remain open to members until February 13.

- **Health in All Policies (HiAP) example walk-through**

Vice Chair Sarah Goodrich extended an invitation to Dr. Kyla Lurry to deliver the example. Dr. Lurry used the attached presentation, focusing on slide 6, which illustrates the link between HiAP and the work of the NHWLC. Discussions revolved around the following questions:

- How will potential communication breakdowns be managed within the HiAP process?
 - Tracy Buck and Dr. Lurry will be the main points of liaison between the various parties and projects.
 - Specific work plans will be implemented in the CHIP and HiAP processes, with clearly defined roles and responsibilities specified.
- Is it possible for the HiAP process to be used to assist the Nashville Community Violence Taskforce?
- Several members from both the NHWLC and MPHD are involved in supporting the Nashville Community Violence Taskforce, which would enable the HiAP process to be implemented.

- **Website preview**

Tracy Buck informed the members that the NHWLC Communications committee has accomplished significant work in creating an engaging website that showcases the identity of the NHWLC and the initiatives they undertake. Tracy Buck then introduced Colton McKay, MPHD Epidemiologist, who spearheaded the project to develop the website utilizing the ARCGIS Story Map platform. Colton McKay offered a demonstration of the existing production site. The Story Map will be featured on the MPHD Nashville.gov website. The NHWLC page will be relocated from its current position, which is somewhat hidden within the Epidemiology page, to a more prominent spot in the Directory labeled “Advancing Community Health Improvement.” The members expressed their appreciation for the efforts and the results achieved so far. Plans are in place to launch the new page in February.

- **CHIP Social Media video series**

Tracy Buck announced that Chair Robert Robinson recorded multiple videos for social media content related to the 2026-2028 CHIP. Matt Peters, the Communication Director of MPHD, oversees the series production.
