WHAT IS A COMMUNITY PLAN? Community Plans guide future growth and preservation decisions made by Metro government. This includes recommendations to Metro Council on zone change requests. WHAT ARE THE CURRENT COMMUNITY PLAN (LAND USE) POLICIES?

The current policy for the plan amendment area is District Industrial (D IN). This policy maintains, enhances or creates Industrial Districts in appropriate locations. There are also small areas of Conservation Policy (CO), which is intended to preserve environmentally sensitive land features.

WHAT CHANGES ARE PROPOSED? (SEE MAP ON REVERSE FOR MORE DETAIL)

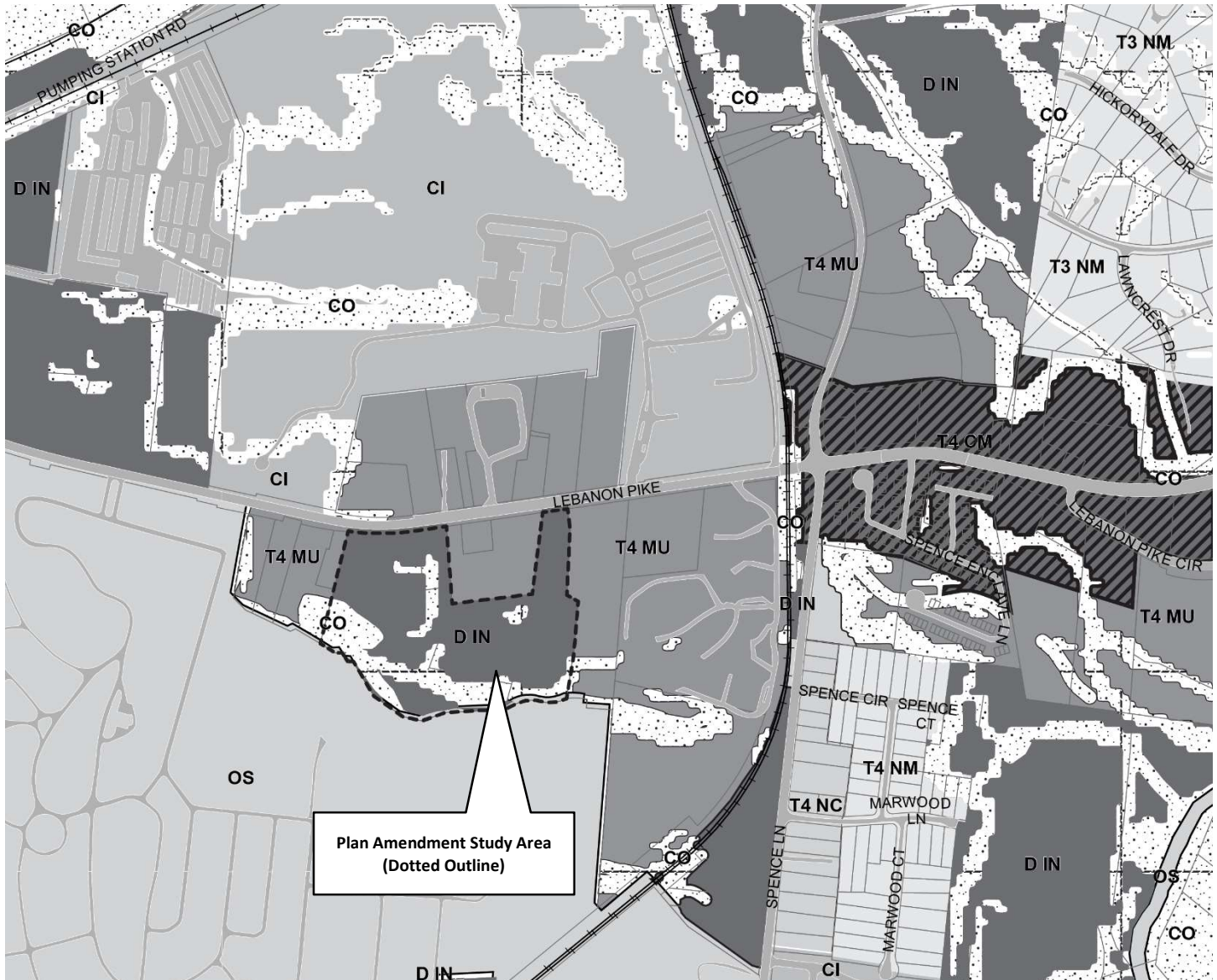
The plan amendment request would change the areas of D IN, to T4 MU, or Urban Mixed Use Neighborhood policy. The T4 MU policy includes a variety of housing, along with mixed use, commercial, institutional, and light industrial development.
